rights, accused the Ford Administration of having failed to make "serious efforts to get the Russians to permit greater numbers of people to emigrate freely to the countries of their choice." But Ford told the B'nai B'rith convention that he was working with Soviet Communist Party Secretary Leonid I, Brezhnev and key members of Congress to restore Soviet Jewish emigration to its previous level.

At a special convention session deveted to

At a special convention session devoted to Soviet Jewry Eugene Gold, chairman of the National Conference on Soviet Jewry, critici-zed both Ford and Carter for advocating quiet diplomacy as a means to alleviate the struggle of Soviet Jewry. He said public diplomacy was needed also such as the Helsinki agreement and the Jackson - Vanik amendment. "Quiet diplomacy alone never helped a Soviet Jew, he said.

Ford, in his address, also pledged anew his support for a "strong Israel" and said he was supporting "international action to stamp out terrorism wherever it occurs." He promised terrorism wherever it occurs." He promised U.S. support for Israel against "attempts to deny Israel her full rights of membership in the United Nations." Ford declared that he in-tends to pursue the "negotiating process" in the Middle East, "I do not promise you it will be easy," the President said, adding there will be "no imposed solutions -- but agreements whose terms are hammered out between the parties, as in the Sinai agreement." Ford also pledged there will be "no one-sided concessions." Declaring that he was "proud to stand on my consistent 28 - year record of support for Israel," Ford said the U.S. "will nd firm in its commitment to Israel's security and survival.

Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger, in an unscheduled speech to the convention, said "there is no disagreement in our purposes and those of Israel" in "the main direction of our policy" both on goals and tactics. The friendship of the U.S. and Israel "has always been a touchstone of the validity of our foreign policy in general,"
he said. As did Ford, Kissinger said "I will
not pretend to you that the future will be easy."
But he noted, "I do say that the prospects for
negotiating toward peace in the Middle East
seems to me never to have been better."
