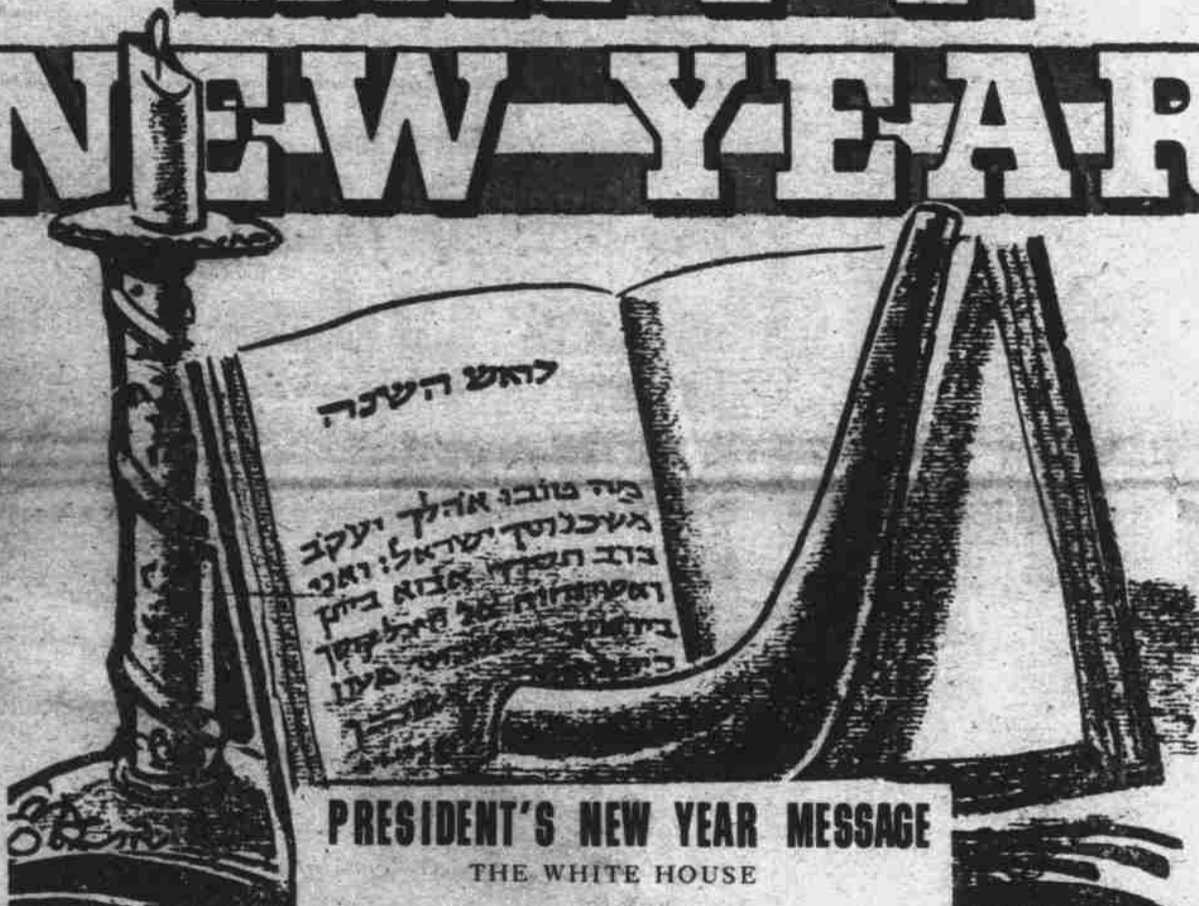

### OIL FIRMS JOIN ARABS TO ENFORCE BOYCOTT

WASH. (WNS) -- Major American Oil companies and pro-Arab groups are trying to defeat the anti-boycott measure now being considered by Congress.

Rep. Joshua Eilberg (D. Pa.) is circulating a letter received from H. C. Kauffmann, president of the Exxon Corp., warning that the amendment "could very well result in a stricter enforcement of Arab boycott practices and jeopardize our country's ability to meet its ever increasing needs for oil imports."

Every autumn the Jewish people observe what are known as the High Holidays.

This is a period of ten days beginning with Rosh Hashana, which means New Year, and ending with Yom Kippur, the day of Atonement.
