## ISRAEL'S ECONOMIC GROWTH STYMIED

TEL AVIV (WNS) --The stagnation in Is economic growth that has exist-ed since 1974 will con-tinue through 1976, Finance Minister Yehoshua Rabinowitz told Americans and Canadian Jewish leadparticipating in 1976 Jerusalem Leadership Conference of the Israe Israel Bond Organization,

He said the gross national product will increase by only one to two percent while in-flation will continue with a 30 percent increase in prices. But Rabinowitz said the government's new economic policy is working and achieved results that surpassed the targets for the first half of 1976.

He said the govern-ment should be able to reach its goal of doubling Israel's pro-duction by 1980 through the investment of \$2.8 billion, the major share coming from Israel Bonds, and by shifting som workers from some 6000 service jobs to industry.
