OIL FIRMS, FORD MEN, JOIN ARABS TO BLOCK ANTI-BOYCOTT MEASURE

UN URGED TO CONDEMN TERRORISM

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- The General Assembly was urged by West Germany to draft an international convention making it illegal to take hostages and requiring that hijackers are either extradited or brought to trial in the country where they are caught.

"Acts involving the taking of hostages are a threat to international relations," West German Foreign Minister Hans Dietrich Genscher told the 31st General Assembly. "The efforts made by all states to settle international conflicts peacefully and also the endeavors of this world organization to make peace more secure are placed in jeopardy by criminal acts of

violence committed by a few." He said that after "the bitter experience" of recent months, all governments must unite in condemning the seizure of hostages and introduce measures against it.

Costa Rican Foreign Minister Gonzalo J. Facio also urged Assembly action against terrorism while praising Israel for its rescue of hostages at Entebbe Airport in Uganda. "Enough words, enough of hesitation," Facio said. "What is needed is glorious acts such as Entebbe." He said Israel should feel "proud in setting a precedent in acting against terrorism." Facio praised Israeli Ambassador Chaim Herzog.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Jewish leaders have urged President Ford to act to save the Export Administration Act including its provisions aimed at combatting the Arab boycott.

The bill which has to be considered by a Senate - House conference committee because of differences between the versions of the two bodies is stalled in Congress and it is believed that only strong support from the Ford Administration can save it.

An aide to Sen. Adlai Stevenson (D. Ill.), who along with Sen. J. Harrison Williams (D.NJ) introduced the Senate anti-boycott provisions, said the "bill is doomed" because of opposition by the Administration and its Senate allies. Sen. John Towers (R, Texas) chairman of the Senate Republican Policy Committee said he would block any effort to bring the bill to a vote. Towers and Sen. Robert Allen (D, Ala.) have prevented the Senate Republicans from naming its members of the conference committee.

The Export Administration Act which expires unless an extension is approved only says that it is American policy to be opposed to any boycott. The new bill carries provisions establishing penalties for American firms who comply with boycott provisions.

The Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations and the American Jewish Committee both sent telegrams to Ford asking him to use his "personal intervention" to assure the bill's passage.

Rabbi Alexander Schindler, chairman of the Presidents Conference, declared that "Economic blackmail must be resisted. America cannot sell its principles for oil money." Elmer Winter, AJCommittee chairman, said in that group's

JIMMY TALKS TO JEWS

RUSSIA NEGLECTS TO ATTACK ISRAEL

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) -- Another sur-

prising element marking the opening of the 31st session of the General Assembly was the seemingly new approach to the Middle East question taken by Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko in his lengthy speech delivered here last week.

Containing no direct attack against Israel, no harsh words about Israeli "aggression," as has been the custom in past sessions, the speech noted that "the protracted tension in the Middle East gives no ground for the conclusion that the situation there is hopeless. A good basis for establishing peace in the region has been worked out through the efforts of many States, including the Soviet Union."

Completely omitting any reference to the PLO, he bemoaned the tragedy besetting Lebanon.
