The House version, adopted by a 318 - 63 vote, carries stiffer provisions on the boy-cott than the Senate version which had been adopted earlier. The Senate measure, introduced by Sens. Stevenson (D. Adlai Ill.) and J. Harrison Williams (D. N.J.), requires companies to disclose any compliance with th with the Arab but does not

specifically prohibit an American com-pany from refusing to do business with Israel. Both bills, in addition to requiring disclosure, forbid concerns American from discrimination on the basis of race, re-ligion, sex or national origin.
