

**JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS**

TEL AVIV -- A new international trade event, the Jerusalem Jewellery and Arts & Crafts Fair, will present Israel's growing production in these fields to international buyers of jewellery, giftware and decorative accessories. The buyers' week will take place March 6 - 12, at the Hilton Hotel, Jerusalem, with more than 100 Israeli manufacturers exhibiting their new export lines.

TEL AVIV -- A new Residence Club intended for people wishing to reside in Israel is nearing completion in one of north Tel Aviv's new upper middle - income neighborhoods. Introduced to Israeli housing by Isralom, Israel Homes & Real Estate Ltd., a six-story 48 - condominium apartment building designed for persons who wish to live in a socially congenial "club-like atmosphere" is rising in the fully - developed Bavli quarter.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- President Ford in signing the Tax Reform Bill had no comments on its provisions aimed at combatting the Arab boycott. The bill provides tax penalties for companies that comply with the boycott.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- A military court has found an Israeli Army officer guilty of responsibility for the death of Ahmed Dib Dahoul, secretary of the local Communist party in Salfit village in Samaria last summer.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- President Ford and Democratic Presidential candidate Jimmy Carter have been asked by the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations and B'nai B'rith to reschedule their third television debate October 22 because it falls on a Friday night. The two organizations have also called on the two Vice - Presidential candidates Sens. Robert Dole and Walter Mondale to reschedule their October 15 debate because it falls on a Friday night and the eve of the final days of Succoth.

PARIS (WNS) -- The end of politicization by UNESCO, the World Health Organization, the International Labor Organization and other such specialized agencies of the United Nations was urged by some 160 prominent scientists, writers, and intellectuals.

WILMINGTON, DEL. (WNS) -- Jewish historical material was contained in a Bicentennial time capsule which was buried in Wilmington Square here.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Moshe Rivlin, director general of the Jewish Agency for the past 11 years, is expected to become the new chairman of the Jewish Agency. He will succeed Yaacov Tzur.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Independent monitoring by the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith has revealed "record levels of anti-Semitism" in Argentina.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Avraham Litvinsky, a son of one of the founders of Tel Aviv, who died recently in Switzerland, has left \$1.2 million to the Tel Aviv Zoo and the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals.

BRUSSELS (WNS) -- A small neo-Nazi group known as Wolfsangel has been identified by the police as being responsible for writing anti-Semitic slogans on a monument to the memory of Belgium's Jewish war dead.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Carroll Rosenbloom, owner of the Los Angeles Rams, protested to National Football Commissioner Pete Rozelle about scheduling the Miami - Rams game only a few hours before the start of Yom Kippur.

NEW YORK -- American high school graduates up to age 25 have a new opportunity to spend a full six months on a kibbutz, working and studying Hebrew under the new provisions of Project Etgar, a program sponsored by the American Zionist Youth Foundation.

NEW YORK -- Terming Earl L. Butz's racial slurs "a natural result" of his being raised in a "racist society," Dr. David Hyatt, President of the National Conference of Christians and Jews, said that many Americans share in his guilt.

NEW YORK -- A call to the New York State legislature to adopt new legislation which would provide for home care for the elderly as an alternative to institutionalization was issued by Rabbi Edwin Katzenstein, chairman of the Commission on Senior Citizens of Agudath Israel of America.


NEW YORK, N.Y. -- More than 50 Controllers and other chief fiscal staff members of Jewish Federations and affiliated agencies representing 34 communities in the United States and Canada attended the Controllers Institute Conference sponsored by the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds, in Detroit.


NEW YORK -- A check for \$2,500.00 together with a message of support was delivered to the NAACP from the National Council of Jewish Women.

ATLANTA -- Paul Zuckerman, an internationally prominent Jewish community leader, was named today as special adviser to the Carter-Mondale campaign.
