

FORD MEETS BROOKLYN JEWISH LEADERS

NEW YORK (WNS) -- President Ford, on his first campaign visit to New York, made specific appeals for votes from Jews in a brief address in front of a Brooklyn Yeshiva high-school and during a closed-door meeting inside the yeshiva by spelling out his stands on arms sales to Saudi Arabia, Soviet Jewish emigration, the Arab boycott and support of Israel.

In a brief address outside the Yeshiva of Flatbush, he told an audience of about 3000, most of them Jews, that there would be no "imposed solution and no one-sided concessions" in U.S. Mideast peace efforts. He also said his Administration would continue to support a strong Israel and that he would himself continue to bring up "again and again" the issue of Soviet Jewry at meetings with Soviet leaders.

The President received a generally polite reception but loud heckling broke out from members of the Student Struggle for Soviet Jewry.

Ford pledged that his Administration

would continue to support Israel and oppose any attempt to oust Israel from the United Nations.

In his closed door meeting, it was learned, Ford spoke to a group of more than 150 Jewish leaders representing the full range of the Jewish community. They included Hasidic and other Orthodox Rabbis as well as rabbis and members of local Conservative, Reform and Sephardic congregations. He reportedly defended U.S. sales of substantial quantities of arms to Saudi Arabia on grounds that because "we can control" the use of such weapons, it is better that the U.S. provide them, rather than "another country," a reference to the Soviet Union.

Ford intimated that the drop in the annual rate of Jewish emigration from Russia from 25,000 to 12,000 stemmed from the restrictions of the Jackson-Vanik and Stevenson amendments to the Trade Reform Act. He reportedly promised to work with Congress to produce legislation to end that problem.

ARAB UN BLAST EXPECTED AFTER ELECTION

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- The UN General Assembly ended its general debate, and while diplomatic sources noted that Israel was not treated as harshly as in last year's Assembly, fear was expressed that the Arab bloc would mount a major assault against Israel after the American

Presidential elections.

The Arab offensive is expected to focus on the report of the 20-member Committee on Palestinian Rights which calls for the establishment of a Palestinian state under the PLO aegis and the withdrawal of Israel from all occupied Arab territories by June

1977. Israel, supported by the West, rejected the committee's recommendations as a blue-print for Israel's destruction in stages.

The Arabs are also expected to try to sabotage a proposal made by West Germany during the 31st General Assembly aimed against international terrorists. West Germany called on the world
