STRIP CHATTER...... A lot of talk about that recent Strip innovation of major hotels to "lease" out their showrooms, lounges on what is known as a "four waller" basis. Hear that several more hotels will be initiating the policy that allows a producer to rent the showroom for his own act, show, revue, etc. So far the only hotels to have experimented with the policy have been the Thunderbird, Tropicana and Aladdin. If more follow, it could become a serious trend. As practiced currently, the hotel has no financial risk (other than some advertising costs) in leasing out their showrooms. The act or producer shoulders the responsibility for both the costs of the show and cast PLUS all the costs required by the union controlled showrooms including the culinary workers, stagehands, light, sound, musicians, etc. Ask anyone who's tried it.... it CAN get very expensive and very risky...... Hear that there's a lot of interest and \$\$\$5\$\$\$ to back it up, to present a new version of the famous ZIEGFELD FOLLIES, and it won't be at the Ziegfeld Room of the MGM Grand Hotel...... Zanyman RIP TAYLOR, back from Hawaii, opens his first "new" Sahara Casbar engagement on November 1. Rip will also be playing

the Sahara's mainroom, in December, in that hotel's very intriguing THREE STAR policy. Rip will be on the bill with both TERESA BREWER and JIM BAILEY..... If you were planning to catch ELVIS at the Hilton when he opens his 10 day concert stand there on Dec. 2, DON'T..... unless you were wise enough to grab a ticket for the show when they first went on sale in SEPTEMBER. All of Elvis' shows are completely sold out......

AND OF COURSE YOU KNOW...... that BRECK WALL's long running musical comedy hit "BOTTOMS UP" will be making a special ONE WEEK ONLY stopover engagement, opening November 9 at the Aladdin Bagdad Theater. "Bottoms Up" will be opening mid-November its annual "indefinite" status engagement at Harrah's Reno..... that SHECKY GREENE & ABBE LANE have been set as special costars oepning December 9 at the MGM. Shecky is an MGM headliner; Abbe will go on "loan" from her Strip hotel, the Sahara......that, as of presstime at any rate, Las Vegas will be WITHOUT any afternoon entertainment if the Thunderbird's musical "The Orphans' Revenge"
