for being one - sided, biased, intellectually dishonest and expedient for allowing itself to become a tool in the hands of the Palestine Liberation Organization and to adopt as its recommendations, the political objectives of that organization, Herzog said.

The 20 - member committee has recom-

mended the establishment of a Palestinian state under PLO aegis and calls for Israel's withdrawal from all Arab territories by June, 1977. It also recommended that Arab refugees to allowed to return to their former homes.

Herzog noted that other refugee problems

have been solved while the Arab states are un-willing to solve the problem of Palestinian re-fugees who were driven out of Arab countries, "Let me make it quite clear," Herzog said, "that we will not at any state consider valid

"that we will not at any state consider valid any discussion of the refugee problem in the Middle East if half of that problem, the Jewish refugee problem, is ignored."

Herzog charged that the Palestine Committee's "recommendations for Israeli withdrawal do not stop at the 1967 line but imply the stage - by - stage truncation of the Jewish State until it totally disappears." He said that the committee "has produced a report designed to move our area away from peace, ignoring as it does the fact that no dictated ignoring as it does the fact that no dictated solution will be accepted by Israel, ignoring as it does the centrality of the process of negotiations in solving any conflict."

Carter Will Prevail

President Ford never fooled us for a minute with all those promises during the campaign of his continued support for Israel.

He had tipped his mitt a year earlier calling for reassessment of the Mideast policy and would have dumped Israel. Fortunately the people of the United States refused to be scared by Arab threats and that told Ford what side his bread was buttered.

So the next step was to veto a U.N. General Assembly resolution that would have condemned Israel for not giving up the West Bank. Israel was asking for a permanent peace settlement before pulling out of the occupied territory. Ford, with an eye towards the nomination, was back with his false facade of promises of support

A few months later Ford gave himself away, catering to petrol dollars and U.S. oil interests, with massive arms sales to the Arabs. But the real tipoff of the man's feeling about Israel was the balkings over the Arab boycott of American firms doing business with Israel. How the Commerce Department squirmed and twisted in every effort not to name the companies who were complying with the Arab blackmail. The names were finally released THE DAY AFTER the issue was raised by Carter in the TV debates.

Then came the election and Ford's demise. Now we can know the honest, deep, true nature of the man who will remain in office only until January 20. It came out last week in all

its glory.
The U.S. voted at the UN to condemn Israel on almost an identical issue that the U.S. had vetoed last March. William Safire of the New York Times said Ford was telling Israel to "drop dead."

Here's exactly what a lame duck President did to the people of the United States in their relations with Israel. He allowed our country to endorse a resolution that calls for Israel to ithdraw from all occupied territory by June, 1977 and establish a Palestine state. This was contrary to every promise, every word of en-couragement, every movement of support to Israel made by any President of the United States. Ford breached the unshakeable commitment by the U.S. to the security of Israel.

Ford no longer is wishy - washy about Is-

rael. He is strictly pro-Arab. Fortunately, President -elect Jimmy Carter, who has yet to break a promise, made himself crystal - clear about the Palestinian problem.
