UNESCO CONDEMS ISRAEL'S POLICIES

PARIS (WNS) -resolution condemning Israel's policies in the occupied territories was adopted by UNESCO's Pro-gram Commission November 18 by a 73-7 vote with 30 ab-stensions, according report to a received here from Nairobi, Kenya.

The resolution must now be adopted by the plenary session of the UNESCO general con-ference, but it is believed unlikely that vote will be the

The resolution said that UNESCO con-demned Isráel's po-licies "as contrary to human rights and to fundamental liberties, all violations result-ing from the Israeli occupation, of the rights of the Pales-tinians living in all the occupied Arab territories to nation al education and cultural life....particu-larly by a systematic policy of cultural assimilation."




