Back to AZA history and traditions. This week - the chapter level. Every member (aleph) in AZA must belong to a chapter located throughout the world. When an aleph joins his first 4 to 6 weeks he is known as an AIT, (Aleph-in-Training). This period is where the job of the Aleph Moreh comes in. He learns about the history of the order and the chapter he is joining, parliamentary procedure, and just how AZA runs and things of that nature. After that he is given an evaluation to see how he learned what information was given.

Every aleph is eligible to run for any office at any time of elections. Elections in Las Vegas are held approximately in March and September. Installations follow as shortly as possible after. Sometimes in Vegas because of the Queen Esther Ball we hold elections in February, but they don't take office until March after the ball when installations are held.
