(Continued from Page I) to act as soon as possible to implement the recommendations. The Council earlier this year rejected the report when the United States vetoed it. Those voting against the Assembly resolu-tion were Israel, the U.S., Canada, Great Bri-tain, the Netherlands, Norway, Luxemberg, Ice-land, West Germany, Australia, Denmark, Bel-gium, Costa Rica, Guatemala, Haiti, and Nicara-gua. Among those who abstained were Italy gua. Among those who abstained were Italy, gua. Among those who abstained were Italy, France, Austria, Japan, Ireland, Finland, Por-tugal, New Zealand, Mexico, Sweden, Ivory Coast, Malawi, Nepal, Figi, Botswana and Lesotho. Eight countries did not participate including Argentina, Brazil, Honduras, Zaire and the Cen-tral African Republic.

During the Assembly debate on the report November 23, U.S. Ambassador William Scran-ton called the recommendations "totally devoid of balance with conclusions that are unworkable of balance with conclusions that are unworkable and recommendations which prejudice the outcome of negotiations." He said the recom-mendations "frankly and bluntly" make the "UN look ridiculous." Scranton noted that "there is no mention of the right of an Israel to exist in the Middle East." He said "the need for the Palestinians to accept the legiti-macy and reality of the State of Israel is utterly ignored. The maintenance of normal and peacemacy and reality of the State of Israel is utterly ignored. The maintenance of normal and peace-ful relations with Israel within the framework of an overall peace settlement is not mentioned. Scranton also pointed out that "nowhere in the recommendation is there the stipulation that the Arab states as well as Israel must join in end-ing the state of war and in arriving at a peace-ful settlement in the area. Even these few examples make clear the one-sidedness and lack of balance in the committee's report," Scran-ton said. ton said.

In Jerusalem November 25, a Foreign Minis-try spokesman denounced the Assembly's resolution as a setback to Mideast peace efforts. The spokesman said the resolution demonstrates The spokesman said the resolution demonstrates again that the Arabs can push through any Israel resolution with their built - in majority of Communist bloc and Third World countries. Rabin, who was in Geneva, said the resolution was unworthy of comment. "I have stopped counting the anti-Israel resolutions," he said.

The U.S. voted for one resolution and abstained on another November 23 dealing with refugees. The U.S. was one of three countries to abstain when the Assembly voted 118-2 for a resolution calling for steps to be taken for the immediate return of Palestinian refugees to the camps from which they were removed in the camps from which they were removed in the Gaza Strip. Israel and Costa Rica voted against the resolution.

The U.S. was one of 118 countries to vote for a resolution reaffirming the right of Palestinian refugees to return to their homes and camps in territories occupied by Israel since Israel and Costa Rica were again the lone 1967. dissenters with two countries abstaining.

RIBICOFF URGES KISSINGER ROLE

wASH. (WNS) Urging the continu tion of Secret continuation of Secretary of State Henry Kissinger in a negotiating role for a Middle East settlement, Sen. Abraham D. Ribbicoff (D. Conn.) declared November 23 that "the time was never more ripe" for an Is-- Arab peace raeli settlement,

Speaking at a press conference after he and 12 other Sena-tors returned from a visit to Israel, Egypt, Jordan and Iran, Ribicoff stressand ed that "nothing could be achieved hieved intervention" in fideast, "I feel without U.S. intervention in the Mideast. "I feel strongly that the best "President-elect Jimmy) Carter could make would be to designate Kissinger as his special envoy to carry out these negotiations." Ribicoff, who first pro-posed retaining Kiss-inger as a Mideast negotiator during a press conference Jerusalem, said here that Kissinger is the "one man" who has the respect of all leaders in the Middle East.

Sen. Howard Baker (R. Tenn.), who along with Ribicoff led the Senate delegation on the Mideast fact-finding mission on the proposed sale of U.S. nuclear reactors, said that Carter told him he would meet with Ribico.f on proposal. H his proposal.
