Direct Negotiations

The Arabs have launched a propaganda offensive in which they claim their willingness to reach a peace settlement with Israel. But their actions demonstrate that the only settlement they want is not a negotiated agreement but one in which the Arab demands are imposed on Israel.

This is evidenced by the plethora of anti-Israeli resolutions which this year, as in years past, take up half of the time of the United Nations General Assembly. The most serious of these was the Assembly's recent adoption by a 90 - 16 vote a resolution called for Israel's evacuation of all occupied territory by next June and the establishment there of a Palestinian state under the leadership of the Palestine Liberation Organization.

The resolution adopted the PLO-inspired recommendations of the Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People. Nothing could be better devised to wreck Mideast negotiations than this and other resolutions that have been passed or will be passed in the General Assembly.

Israel has rightly rejected the resolution. The Jewish State is correct in its assertion that a settlement cannot be imposed on Israel but must come through negotiations between the countries involved.

The essence of the present situation was clearly put by Israeli Premier Yitzhak Rabin when he addressed the recent jubilee conference of the World Union of Progressive Judaism. Rabin noted that the Arabs, and especially Egyptian President Anwar Sadat, have told American Senators and Congressmen, newsmen and other visitors of their desire for peace.

"I have heard what you have had to say to others," Rabin said addressing himself to Sadat. "Now, what do you have to say to me? If you really want progress toward peace, then let us -- your country and mine -- negotiate peace."

The Arabs, as Rabin noted, have been talking to everyone but Israel about peace. If they really want a settlement they will have to stop their UN moves exacerbating the situation and address themselves directly to Israel through face - to - face negotiations.

At The United Nations

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) This 31st session of the General Assembly, in the view of this writer, has transformed the United Nations into an "Arab market - place where the central bargaining point has been the "buying" and "selling" of votes -- all at the expense of the Jewish State.

In effect, the "vendors" had something to sell. It was all very tempting. What does little Israel really mean to you in the face of our petro - dollar wares. "Give us your vote and we'll reward you handsomely"; "vote with us and we'll vote for you."

Thus Greece and Turkey, vying for support on the Cyprus issue, fell in line; so did Pakistan and India who hoped for backing on the Kashmir question, and Makarios' Island not only joined the anti - Israel majority but it also lent its name to the sponsors of one of the major pro - Arab resolutions. Among the other "buyers" in the Arabian market-place were, of course, many Africans and Asians and in one case -- the resolution "deploring Israel's refusal to permit displaced inhabitants" in Gaza and elsewhere to return to their slums -- even the United States along with some of the Western states.

Here Costa Rica alone courageously stood with Israel in voting against this draft which mustered 118 votes with 2 abstentions, Malawi and Papua New Guinea.

What could Israel's Ambassador Chaim Herzog say in the face of this scandalous and immoral UN performance except to note that "the General Assembly has been hijacked by a group of Arab extremists." But few cared here or took note.

The very self - same day in which the United States voted for the anti - Israeli resolution on "population and refugees displaced since 1967," Ambassador Scranton, in what appeared as an "evenhanded" stance, launched a strong attack against another resolution based on the infamous report of the Committee of 20 on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People. Of course, he had no choice. This was the very report he had previously vetoed in the Security Council.

The following day, on the eve of Thanksgiving, the General Assembly, in concluding its debate on the "Question of Palestine," gave the Arabs what they had failed to achieve in the Council. It adopted this totally one - sided draft which, in essence, spells the dissolution of the Jewish State. It could not be interpreted in any other way.

The vote was 90 in favor, 16 against with 30 abstentions.

Let's put on record those who voted against this resolution: Australia, Belgium, Canada, Costa Rica, Denmark, Federal Republic of Germany, Guatemala, Haiti, Iceland, Israel, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Nicaragua, Norway, United Kingdom and the United States.

Those that abstained must also be noted: Austria, Bahamas, Barbados, Bolivia, Botswana, Chile, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Fiji, Finland, France, Cambodia, Grenada, Ireland, Italy, Ivory Coast, Jamaica, Japan, Lesotho, Malawi, Mexico, Nepal, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Paraguay, Portugal, Surinam, Sweden and Uruguay.

Nine delegations saw it fit not to be present for the voting. These, too, should be counted: Albania, Argentina, Brazil, Central African Republic, Honduras, Seychelles, South Africa, Swaziland and Zaire.

Ambassador Scranton, in what appeared as one of the strongest statements he had made here at the UN so far, told the Assembly that the resolution contains "no mention of the right of an Israel to exist in the Middle East" and

One of the Congressmen re-elected November 2 was Henry Waxman, of California.
