Exercise in Hypocrisy

Twenty - one years ago, a San Francisco summit conference of great powers made it possible for a war - shattered world to establish the United Nations. The charge of declared the aim succinctly: "for maintenance of world peace."

The year of the birth of this forward - looking parliament of nations was studded with historic events: Leaders met at Yalta in February; President Roosevelt died in April, the same month in which Mussolini was caught and put to April also brought Hitler's dramatic Potsdam followed in July and August. Hiroshima was devastated by an American atom bomb in August. Vidking Quisling, whose name now besmirches our dictionaries, was executed in October, the same month in which the UN Charter went into effect.

Now, after 21 years of an exhausting hunt for peace, some of the founding powers of the UN together with newcomers, have fastened a blight of deceit, double dealing, and dishonesty upon this once proud pillar of hope. Certain resolutions dealing with the scandal of apartheid revealed UN machinations at their worst. One of these resolutions, condemn-ing "Tel Aviv - Pretoria (South Africa) ties," belied all claims to diplomatic sincerity advanced by its sponsors.

larael's Ambassador to the UN, Chaim Herzog, has branded this monstrosity "an inevitable exercise in hypocrisy." Lobbying for its passage, Arab states were, in the Ambassador's opinion, seizing upon the struggle of black records an opportunity to pursue gle of black people, an opportunity to pursue their own narrow and destructive aims in the

The actual story of Israel's economic and political commerce with South Africa has been well documented; but it needs constant airing. In short, Israel's traffic with the regions in which apartheid prevails parallels that of many nations, including 19 black African states. In short, Israel's traffic with the regions Sovereign powers polluting the UN forum with censorship of Israel should, if they behaved with integrity, turn that sword of condemna-

with integrity, turn that sword of condemnation upon themselves.

Moshe Decter has drawn up a fact sheet exposing the deviltry behind the attack upon Israel. His study, compiled for the American Jewish Congress, discloses that Mozambique, Liberia, Swaziland and the other black African states carrying on flourishing trade with South Africa do hundreds of millions of dollars more business with Pretoris than Israel. lars more business with Pretoria than Israel does.

And if suspicion is sown, as it was in Newsweek, Aug. 23, about Israel's arms trade with the apartheid - afflicted nations, it must be pointed out that the United States, France, Great Britain, West Germany, Jordan, the Soviet Union, and other nations are engaged in similar commerce with South Africa.

Inasmuch as this new plot against Israel in the UN bred concern among black Ameri-cans, it is helpful to note the recent correspondence between Bayard Rustin, director of the Black Americans to Support Israel Com-mittee (BASIC) and Rabbi Arthur Hertzberg, president of the American Jewish Congress. Mr. Rustin wrote to Rabbi Hertzberg to ex-

press the dismay of blacks concerning the visit to Israel of South African Prime Minister Vorster. "Was Israel repudiating its hosti-lity to apartheid?" he asked.

Rabbi Hertzberg's thoughtful reply, detailing the history of close educational and scien-tific partnerships entered into by Israel and Africa as well as the necessity for trading with South Africa, satisfied Mr. Rustin completely.

The Hertzberg - Rustin correspondence and the Decter report should be read by all who seek enlightenment on this complex issue.

If in Lebanon the Arabs could have done what they did against their own brother Arabs -- torture and slaughter of some 50,000 people, among them innocent civilians -- one need not guess as to what extremes they would have gone had not the Israel Defense Forces withstood their murderous legions.

It is no wonder then that Israel has taken the great precautions she has for her security in the territories forced upon her to take in wars initiated by her enemies and why Jerusalem continues to insist on direct negotiations with the view to bringing about an end to the 'state of war' still in force.

And if it's a 'state of war' -- so be it!

The Arabs must realize that a 'state of war'

gives rights to two sides. It cannot be a one-way street as they insist it be. Since time immemorial it has been the custom among nations at war for the victors and the defeated to meet face to face at a peace conference to work out a final settle-

And whereas the Arabs lost the several wars with Israel -- as proved by their frantic calls for UN cease - fires to rescue them from total defeat -- it is imcumbent upon them to sue for peace via negotiations. Why should the UN allow for an exception to be made only in the case of the Jewish people?

Moreover, in all past wars, the defeated aggressor always had to pay a price for his aggression -- in territory. In the case of the Arab - Israeli wars, the West Bank never legally belonged to Jordan, nor did the Gaza Strip belong to Egypt. What remains is a settlewith Egypt over Sinai and with Syria on an adjustment of the Golan Heights. As for the future stature of the Palestinians, that is a matter which Israel is ready to take up in the context of talks with the Jordanians and not with the PLO leadership.

Israel, the victor, has held out the olive branch for almost 30 years now without any response from any of the Arabs. "How long are we supposed to wait before the Arabs decide to sit down and enter into negotiations?" Israel's Ambassador Jacob Doron asked the Special Political Committee here last week.

"The selective, distorted process which has become the norm in the crooked looking glass of the United Nations," he declared, "no majority could be mustered to set up an inquiry as to what went on behind the curtains of those critics of my country."

It is a sad commentary on the present state of affairs in the world that nations, big and small, in having forgotten the horrors of the Holocaust, once again remain silent as they did during World War II in the full knowledge of what the 'Hitlerites' are up to in our very days vis-a-vis the Jewish people.
