A man for all seasons and for many reasons was Gustave Lehmann Levy, who died in New York last November at the age of 66.

By profession an investment banker who chaired the New York Stock Exchange for two years, Mr. Levy maximally followed the Jewish dictum that a man should be as helpful as possible to others. From humble beginnings in New Orleans, he became one of the nation's leading philanthropists.

One of the eulogists at the funeral in Temple Emanu-El, Manhattan, was Nelson Rockefeller, who, among other labels, characterized Gus as "fabulous,

The overused adjective is an understatement

applied to Gus Levy.

To give you an idea how wide a range of activities Mr. Levy encompassed, let me merely list the names of some of the organizations that saluted him in paid obituaries in the New York Times. Most of these long tributes were spangled with such terms as "dynamic," "extraordinary," "towering," and the like,
