

BEGIN GETS INSTRUCTIONS FROM ISRAELI CABINET

-- The Cabinet has given Premier Menachem Begin a mandate to present his ideas to President Carter when he meets him at the White House in Washington July 19-20. Begin said July 13 that the Cabinet unanimously approved all his points at a special session that day. The Premier said he was going to the United States "with a good feeling" although not without a certain amount of concern because of the importance of his mission. The Cabinet members have complied with the wall of silence that Begin has placed around the meeting.

However, this did not stop Israeli newspapers from speculating on Begin's proposals. Some newspapers have the Premier proposing an overall settlement while others see him offering new interim accords in Sinai and on the Golan Heights.

In addition to his meetings in Washington, Begin is scheduled to be guest of honor of a national dinner under the auspices of the Israel

ASK THAT RUMANIA REMOVE IMMIGRATION OBSTACLES

WASH. (WNS) -- Recommendations for eliminating existing obstacles to the emigration of Rumanian Jews to Israel has

been sent by the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations to Sen. Abraham Ribicoff (D. Conn.), chairman of the Senate Finance Committee's subcommittee on international trade.

The recommendations supplements testimony to the subcommittee by William Korey, representing the Conference, on a hearing on most favored nation trade status for Rumania. The Presidents Conference recommended that all who want to leave should be allowed to apply for an application screening process; punitive

actions such as job dismissals against those who apply for exit visas be ended, the application process be shortened and facilitated; an emigrant be allowed to take his money and personal effects with him and the application fee be reduced.

Korey, at the hearing on June 27, said the Jewish community could go along with President Carter's recommendation that MFN be extended to Rumania for another year, but if Jewish emigration does not increase during the next 12 months the American Jewish community would recommend that the trade benefits be withdrawn.
