Colton, Clark County Registrar of Voters, informs us that although the State and County Elections are over a year away it is time for people who are thinking about being candidates for office to make some decisions about party affiliation. The State Law requires that a candidate for a partisan office must not have changed his party affiliation after September 1st of the year preceding the election in which he may be a candidate, and must re-register to vote under his new party affiliation before September 1st, 1977.
