

Sadat said that he flatly rejected Vance's proposals that a Geneva agreement incorporate normalization of relations between Israel and its normalization of relations between Israel and its Arab neighbors. He also insisted that Israeli withdrawals from occupied territories be com-pleted within six months of signing a peace treaty not in gradual stages over a period of five years as proposed by the Carter Adminis-tration. Sadat said he has alternatives in his mind to deal with the quastion of PLO repremind to deal with the question of PLO representation at the peace talks, something which Is-rael has categorically rejected. He disclosed he received a message from PLO leader Yasir Arafat reminding the Arab states that they had agreed at the Ramat summit meeting in 1974 that the PLO was the sole legitimate representative of the Palestinian people.
