JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Israeli Pound was again devalued August 16 for the fourth time since the new Likud government took office.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Representatives of Pierre Cardin in the U.S. and Canada say reports that the designer bowed to Arab boycott pressure and has withdrawn business from Israel are completely groundless.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Merom Hagolan, the first Israeli settlement on the Golan Heights after the Six Day War, is marking its 10th anniversary. There are now 26 settlements on the Golan with a total population of 3600.

VIENNA (WNS) -- Police reported August 18 that a monument to Sigmund Freud, the founder of psychoanalysis, was smeared with anti-Semitic slogans.

LONDON (WNS) -- Henry Kiyemba, a former Ugandan Minister of Health, has agreed to testify that President Idi Amin ordered the death of Mrs. Doris Bloch if the British government takes the case to the International Court of Justice at The Hague.

CHICAGO (WNS) -- Foremer Foreign Minister Abba Eba declared here that Israel can maintain a balance in the Middle East only "with the support of all the Jewish people," Speaking to the B'nai B'rith international board og governors meeting, Eban warned against returning to the pre - 1967 lines, "You do not achieve peace by reconstructing the very same conditions that produced a war," he said,

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- What type of consensus there is in Israel on the Palestinian question was the central point of a debate between Premier Menachem Begin and former Foreign Minister Yigal Allon in the Knesset August 15.

BONN (WNS) -- A West German prosecutor has confirmed that Herbert Kappler, the 70-year-old former Rome gestapo chief who was serving a life sentence for ordering the shooting of 335 Iralian Jews and non - Jews, is now in the North German district of Lueneberg after his escape from a Rome Military Hospital.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The Palestinine Liberation Organization should be a party to the Geneva talks if it recognizes Israel's right to exist according to Sen. Frank Church (D. Idaho).

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Members of the Soviet Mission to the United Nations refused to see Natalia Shcharansky, wife of the Soviet Jewish activist Anatoly Shcharansky, who has been held in a Soviet prison since last March and faces a possible charge of treason.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- A bus driver and seven passengers were injured when a bomb exploded in the Afula bus station in Central Israel August


WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Hercules, Inc., a chemical company, has paid a \$1000 fine for violations of the Export Administration Act involving the Arab boycott provisions.

CHICAGO (WNS) -- B'nai B'rith President David M. Blumberg urged that young people be given a greater voice in determining the future of Judaism.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- French embassy officials were told of the strong concern of the American Jewish community over the French government's decision to suspend a new antiboycott law as it applied to the Arab boycott

PARIS (WNS) -- A Lebanese weekly published here said that France had agreed to sell Saudi Arabia "hundreds of millions of dollars" worth of airplanes, sophisticated electronic material and other military hardware.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israeli troops killed Ismail Hammed, 27, a terrorist wanted by Israeli authorities since 1969, for the shelling of Jerusalem with Katyusha rockets and the planting of mines, one of which caused the death of four Israeli soldiers in 1971. He is also believed responsible for the recent bombs planted on buses including one which injured 20 persons in Kirves Car. in Kiryat Gat.
