

Rosh Hashanah Message

The High Holy Days are a season of re-affirmation of the hopes and principles which have sustained Jews for 6,000 years and which are part of the foundation of Western society.

Foremost among these hopes is that all men and women may live in peace, free from the inequities and injustice which breed the hostilities and violence enveloping so much of the world. Nowhere is the hope for peace more deeply felt than in Israel. And nowhere is it more difficult to achieve.

In the effort to find a path to peace, the United States and Israel have a common cause. Yet disagreements over policy and stress in their relations have appeared.

In so difficult and complicated a situation, this is perhaps inevitable. But every American citizen and especially every American Jew has a right to expect the governments of both countries to act in such a way as to avoid divisiveness and prevent the bonds between them from becoming frayed. Nothing would please the enemies of freedom and human rights more

than for tensions to set America and Israel apart.

We hope that in the year to come Israel and all the world will move closer to peace, and that freedom will come to our fellow Jews in the Soviet Union and elsewhere, as well as to other people who are denied it.
