CARTER TELLS UN 'COMMITMENT TO ISRAEL SECURITY UNQUESTIONABLE'

NOTORIOUS ARAB URGES PRESSURE ON U.S.

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) -- The ever-smiling Dr. M. T. Mehdi, president of the American - Arab Relations Committee, in a statement issued here, has strongly criticized the Arab Foreign Ministers' decision in Cairo to direct their efforts at preventing Israeli settlements on the West Bank through a UN resolution condemning Israel.

Dr. Mehdi said that the solution of the problem is not in the UN, but in the United States.

In identical cables sent to the Foreign Ministers, Dr. Mehdi urged that the Arabs should concentrate their efforts on the U.S. Government and if need be go over the heads of the President and the Congress to the American people.

He noted in his statement that the Arabs "so far do not understand that Israel exists because of the U.S., not the UN."

An Americanized Arab, Dr. Mehdi is notorious for his anti - Israeli demonstrations.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- President Carter, under attack by Israel, American Jewish leaders and supporters of Israel in Congress because of the joint statement on the Middle East issued October 1 by the United States and the Soviet Union, sought to reassure Israel during a two - day visit to the United Nations and New York.

In a speech to the UN General Assembly October 4 largely devoted to the need to control nuclear arms, Carter declared that "the commitment of the U.S. to Israel's security is unquestionable" and repeated his pledge that the U.S. will not impose a settlement on the Mideast.

Later that day Carter and Secretary of State Cyrus Vance met for seven hours with Israeli Foreign Minister Moshe Dayan out of which emerged a joint U.S. - Israeli announcement at 2 a.m. October 5 that declared that none of the parties to the Mideast conflict have to accept the U.S. - Soviet statement as a "prerequisite for the reconvening and conduct of the Geneva conference." The statement also pointed out that "The United States and Israel agree that Security Council Resolution 242 and 338 remain the agreed basis for the resumption of the Geneva peace conference and that all the understandings and agreements between them on this subject remain in force."

Israel had earlier charged that the U.S. - Soviet agreement went beyond the two resolutions (Continued on Page 3)

Carter is Sincere State Dept. Lousing Up

We urge all readers of this column, be they Jew or Gentile sympathizers of Israel, to disregard the slanted stories appearing in the daily press, the news magazines and the TV reports about a rift between the U.S. and Israel.

What the newsmen are doing is distorting implications released by the State Department to inflame the American public that it is Israel standing in the way of peace in the Middle East. Nothing could be further from the truth.

There are vicious segments in the State Department who have been plotting against Israel since away back in the Kennedy Administration. We do not know why, whether they are on the payroll of the Arabs, the Russians, or the oil companies or whatever. But it appears there has been a consistency to denounce all matters favorable to Israel and more recently to support the Arab demands.

This hate bloc does not represent the United States, being in direct variance with views expressed by our President and a majority of the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives. The State Department maintains it is seeking to achieve peace in the Mideast. Well so do we all, Israel, the Arabs, the American public and all else concerned with the possible exception of Russia. But the State Department road to peace is the same peace achieved by Kissinger in South Vietnam. Israel will not go along with it. Here's what is happening.

All signs point toward a Geneva peace conference before the end of this year. Israel is willing and ready to negotiate with the Arab nations, who in turn are at the stage of sitting down at the table. The hitch is that the Arabs want the Palestine Liberation Organization to be represented in direct negotiations with Israel. That is where Israel stands firm, refusing to do business with a terrorist group that refuses to recognize Israel and is determined to exterminate the Jewish State.

Israel is well aware of a Palestinian problem and has consented to negotiate with Palestinians who are not members of the PLO. This was an acceptance of President Carter's proposal. But the Arabs insisted on the PLO representation. Why were the Arabs so steadfast? Were they receiving hidden support from the State Department?

Barely three months ago there was a secret

GERMAN LEFTWINGERS MORE DANGEROUS THAN NAZIS

WASH. (WNS) -- West Berlin Mayor Dietrick Stobbe said that leftwing extremists were more a danger in West Germany than neo-Nazis. Stobbe, who paid a courtesy call on President Carter at the White House, said this was his response, when Vice President Walter Mondale raised

the question of the growing ultra-right-wing extremism in Germany. Former West German Chancellor Willy Brandt, now chairman of the Social Democratic Party (SPD), has written to Chancellor Helmut Schmidt expressing concern about the increasing rise of neo-Nazism in Germany and asking the government to tackle the problem. "Brandt wrote the letter to make clear the German people should look at both sides," Stobbe said. "That's my personal opinion, too."

He said that there is a "small but totally controlled" National Party of Germany in Berlin whose members are forbidden to hold meetings. There are far more leftwing extremists "with a certain anti - Israel feeling which concerns me a lot and gives me sorrow," Stobbe said.
