secret agreement only tangled further the web of what some here saw as part of a diplomatic intrigue and threatened to complicate relations between Jerusalem and Washington. Yoel Markus, the U.S. correspondent for Haaretz, claimed October 16 that such a document was agreed upon in addition to the U.S. - Israel orking paper on Geneva procedure which the working paper on Geneva procedure which the Cabinet and Knesset have approved. He also suggested that similar documents may have been signed between the U.S. and the Arab states. Markus attributed his information to "know-ledgeable sources."
