advertise exclusively in the R-J. (This is the determination of a U.S. Judge in a court of law -- not an irresponsible claim by Greenspun.)

Greenspun said he will appeal the judge's decision. We say GOORNISH HELFEN (nothing will help) because as a subpoenaed witness (by Greenspun) at the trial, it was evident he was a loser all the way. In his column Greenspun calls witnesses perjurers, which is a sign of desperation or senility for a newspaperman, whose words should have meaning and should be factually accurate.

Greenspun also claimed that the day Summa cancelled its advertising in the Sun, the ad budget was doubled for the R-J and \$150,000 in cash was advanced to a scandal sheet in addition to subsidizing another blackmail publication. Without naming them he wrote of "a few scandal sheets which were in business primarily to besmirch the Sun and its publisher."

If Greenspun was referring to the LAS VEGAS ISRAELITE, he is a motivated liar, and he knows it. The ISRAELITE has been most outspoken in setting the record straight after each and every one of his brash, impudent, unfounded bleatings. We refused to allow his rant-

gations which, for political expediency, have remained silent on this issue -- an issue which is bound to affect every country in this organization. In so doing they have become themselves accomplices."

As your correspondent recalls the dynamic Herzog went on to strike notes which brought a shudder into the Council chamber. "Seated in the dock today," he charged, "are all those countries which have collaborated with the terrorists and which have aided and abetted them. In the dock before us stand all those countries that cry to the high heavens when they are affected by terrorists, that fulminate at this Security Council when their citizens or diplomats are threatened, and that remain silent when the same happens to citizens of other countries."

"Yes," Herzog continued in his indictment, "before us stand accused this rotten, corrupt, brutal, cynical, bloodthirsty monster of international terrorism and all those who support it in one way or another, whether by commission or omission. Facing them today are the ordinary decent human beings throughout the world who seek nothing more than to live a life free from terror and from intimidation, free from the threat of hijackers, the indiscriminate bombs of terrorists and the blackmail of criminals and murderers."

The failure of the General Assembly and the Security Council to heed Israel's warnings or to follow up on Dr. Kurt Waldheim's initiative after the Munich massacre to grapple with the problem realistically has now come home to roost through the world - wide threat of action by the Air Line Pilots Associations. But more than that, pressure is mounting even within the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO), a specialized UN agency, which has just called on all states that have not yet done so to ratify the Tokyo, the Hague and the Montreal Conventions which call for severe action to be taken against hijackers.

Yes, 'terrorism' has now 'struck' this world organization.

New Generation

Our generation's leading Jewish seminaries now are led by a new crop of young rabbis.

With the appointment of Rabbi Norman Lamm to head Yeshiva University, the old epoch marked by the administrations of Louis Finkelstein (Conservative), Nelson Glueck, (Reform) and Samuel Belkin (Orthodox) has come to an end.

Rabbi Lamm is 44. The head of the Reform School, Hebrew Union College - Jewish Institute of Religion, Rabbi Alfred Gottschalk is 46. Rabbi Gerson Cohen, Chancellor of the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, is 50.

The Conservative seminary is still called, in some quarters, Schechter's, recalling the long tenure of the great scholar, Solomon Schechter.

The Reform seminary is sometimes called the Wise School, since each of its components was founded by a Wise: Isaac, in Cincinnati, Stephen in New York. There are now branches of this school in New York, Los Angeles, and Jerusalem.

The impact of Samuel Belkin, successor to the late Bernard Revel, on American Jewish life, has been enormous and lasting.

Each of the new generation of leaders has impressive credentials and an enormous challenge to live up to the standards of their celebrated predecessors.

All three of them are American - trained; Botchkalk was brought here as a youngster, a brand plucked from the Nazi fires.

All three of them know one another. They are friendly towards one another. They are staunch in the defense of their respective denominations but remarkably "ecumenical," in contrast to the chilliness which sometimes characterized the relationships of their predecessors.

A new age is beginning for American Jewry, greatest of all Jewries in history. We wish Rabbi Lamm well in his new post.

And I would add a personal hope; that before the tenures of these young leaders concludes, we could erect an umbrella over all of them. Let each stress the distinctiveness of his own group, but couldn't it take place under one roof?

Harry Lieberman, at 100 years of age, has produced a series of fine oil paintings for the new first edition Jewish Folk Art Calendar 1978 (5738). It is based not only on his distinctive art, but also on his profound philosophy and colorful prose. Printed in full color, it features a series of his interpretations of biblical themes. His ideas are taken from the Talmud, the Gemorrah, the Midrash and the Cabala, from Hebrew and Yiddish folklore and from his lively interest in contemporary events.

Lieberman expresses his thoughts in picturesque words as well as on canvas. He believes that every painting should have a reason and a meaning, so before he takes brush in hand he writes the story of what he wants to portray. He writes and paints with equal vigor and enthusiasm. The 'story' of each painting is included in the 1978 Jewish Folk Art Calendar.

Featured subjects are: Adam and Eve and the Snake, The

Most Orthodox Rabbi, Deliver This to Heaven, Whosoever Reports a Thing, Ezra The Scribe, Two Dreamers, In the Presence of the Sages, Be Strong as a Leopard, The Peaceable Kingdom, The Blessing and the Curse - The Twelve Stones, The Blessing of the Moon, A Song of the Degrees - Psalms, 121.

The daily dare section for each month is artistically decorated with charming Lieberman drawings. His philosophy of life ("My Time") and a detailed biography are also included with appropriate renderings.
