

SEN. JACK SCHOFIELD FOR GOVERNOR

Senator Jack Schofield said he believes Lt. Gov. Bob Rose's stated policy on out-of-state gaming operations by Nevada licensees could ultimately lead to the destruction of this state's major industry and the loss of thousands of jobs.

"This is a key issue, because our very life's blood depends upon how we cope with the spread of gaming outside of Nevada," Schofield said. "Whether a person is a dealer at Caesars Palace, a souvenir shop operator or a construction worker, his livelihood depends upon whether or not the leadership of the state is concerned about his future."

"I believe that he (Rose) is playing with the jobs of the people," Schofield said. "He is apparently willing to sacrifice them, and their security in order to serve the interests of those who gave him money."

"Gaming has always been regarded as a privileged industry," Schofield said, "and that philosophy is what has kept it pure in Nevada. No one has any 'right' to operate a casino, here or anywhere else, unless he is willing to conform to the very stringent regulations which have been set up in the state."

"Rose says there are 'grey areas' in the law. That is just not true. I was in the Legislature when the Foreign Gaming Act was made law during the last session, and the intent of that act was to make it absolutely clear that any Nevada licensee would lose his privilege to operate here if he became engaged in gaming anywhere else where the laws and controls were not as strict as they are in Nevada."

"There is no question about the meaning of this," he said. "If they operated somewhere else where loose laws might allow the underworld to infiltrate or control gaming, they can't do business in the State of Nevada."

"It's very clear. We can make no compromise on this, because it means too much to us, I don't want any Nevada casino operators taking our money out of state and jeopardizing our people's jobs," Schofield said, "and I don't intend to make it easy for them."

"Bob Rose is a captive candidate," Schofield said. "He has sold himself to special interests who want to expand their empires, and now he doesn't care if he's selling out the working people of Nevada."

RACISM CONFERENCE ATTACKS ISRAEL

GENEVA (WNS) -- Israel has been under constant attack at the United Nations - sponsored World Conference to Combat Racism and Racial Discrimination as various countries have sought to link it with South Africa.

Israel and the United States have boycotted the conference because it included the 1975 General Assembly resolution linking Zionism with racism. The Soviet Union has circulated a resolution that includes among other points a reaffirmation of the Zionism is racism resolution. The Syrian delegation has called for Israel to be expelled from the UN. Delegates have strongly attacked Israel as being linked with South Africa, as supplying arms to South Africa and as "oppressing" the Palestinian Arabs in the West Bank and the Gaza Strip.

The nine European Economic Community countries have made it known that they will not accept any resolution condemning Israel or Zionism or that

refers to the Palestinian issue. Canada and the Scandinavian countries are supporting this stand. Some of the Black African countries are proposing a resolution that does not link Zionism with racism but attacks Israel for co-operating with South Africa and accuses Israel of discrimination against the Palestinians.

Leslie Harriman, the Nigerian Ambassador to the UN, blamed the political power of American Jews for the U.S. refusal to attend the conference. "I think that the problem in the U.S. is that the Jews play a major role in the politics of the country," Harriman, who is also chairman of the UN Special Committee Against Apartheid, told reporters "Even though they are only eight million they are very, very strong indeed." (The 1978 edition of the American Jewish Year Book estimates the Jewish population in the U.S. at 5,775,935). The U.S. was also a frequent target of attack at the conference.

JERUSALEM JEWISH GROWTH RATE DECLINES

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Jerusalem's Jewish population grew by 2.4 percent in 1977, the lowest increase since the 1967 Six Day War, according to the Central Bureau of Statistics.

Municipal officials blamed the decline on decreased immigration and the shortage of reasonably-priced housing for young people. Jerusalem's Arab population also declined in its growth rate registering a 3.4 percent increase, as compared to 4.4 percent in 1977.

However, Jerusalem was the only large city in Israel that

showed any growth last year. It has increased its population by 41 percent since the Six Day War.
