

MICHAEL VERCHICK FOR UNIV. REGENT

A 22-year-old University of Nevada, Las Vegas student has filed for the District E seat of the University of Nevada Board of Regents.

Michael Verchick, 2896 La Canada St., said he filed for the position because, "I think I can do a better job in representing the students and faculty."

A senior biology major, Verchick, will run against incumbent Regent John Buchanan.

"My main interests are improving the quality of existing programs," he said. "The main goal of the university should be to train students in a qualified area."

He favors the next community college campus at the West Charleston Heights site rather than the Henderson site: "I think it would serve more people than the Henderson campus."

Verchick feels the community college division should remain under the jurisdiction of the regents. "I would like to see their programs expand, but I think a unified system is more effective."

He plans a career in microbiology or biochemistry research and plans to get his master's from UNLV upon his graduation next spring.

A member of the Phi Kappa Phi Honor Society, Young Democrats, Pre-Professional Club and the union planning committee, Verchick has been a student senator.

He tutors at the university and is employed part-time as an aircraft lineman for Hughes Aviation and in summer construction work.

ELEANOR WALKER FOR ASSEMBLY 4

The open meeting law is useful in changing the feeling of many people that too many governmental decisions are made behind closed doors, said Eleanor Walker, a candidate from Assembly District 4.

Walker, 34, said it may be a good idea to remove the taxes from food and medicine, adding that this tax reform would benefit more people than would a property tax cut.

Before making a decision on whether she should support any kind of property tax reform, Walker said she would consult tax experts and examine types of tax reforms.

The candidate said she feels Nevada should adopt progressive laws to meet

the needs of its citizens and not take a "wait and see" attitude. Timely legislation will help assure that Nevada is able to handle its own affairs by cutting down on intrusion by the federal government, she said.

The rough boundaries of the district are Lake Mead Boulevard on the north, the Las Vegas Expressway and Alta Drive on the south, Michael Way on the west and Highland Drive on the east.

The insurance agent is the former president of the Las Vegas Branch of the NAACP. She received a bachelor of science degree in business administration from the University of Nevada, Las Vegas.

RONALD WITTIG FOR ASSEMBLY 13

Ronald G. Wittig of 395B So. Haven St., Las Vegas, declared his candidacy for Assembly District 13 on the Libertarian Party slate.

Wittig, an active member of the Cousteau Society, and the Defenders of Wildlife, proposes to enact effective and meaningful 'sunset' legislation to reduce those state regulatory agencies which prohibit and restrict free trade within the state. Wittig gives the Public Service Commission, which controls transportation and shipping, as an example. "Its existence restricts competition between

freight and bus lines, creating special interest legislation for carriers, thus preventing a free market. This costs us consumers money."

Wittig, presently employed as a Diesel Mechanic, filed because "I have a deep concern for the voters and citizens in my district, who, up to now, have been the victims of politicians and heavy-handed government. I want to offer these voters the Libertarian alternative to present politics," said Wittig.
