## LAS VEGAS ISRAELITE JIM LOVELAGE FOR ASSEMBLY 4

The surplus in the state budget should be spent wisely to "improve the gen-eral quality of life for people living in Nevada," said Democrat Jim Lovelace.

A candidate from Assembly District 4, Lovelace said that projects such as road improvements should have a lower priority than those projects which would improve the quality of life.

He repeatedly stressed that some of the surplus money could be well spent to implement some new education programs.

The candidate said he thinks Nevada has a fairly reasonable tax structure, but would support a 30 percent property tax cut.

Lovelace said he "whole-heartedly" supports the Equal Rights Amendment because he feels once it is established that everyone is equal, Americans can put the equality issue behind them and go ahead to tackle other problems.

He said he thinks the people of his district are en-

If elected, he said he will work for the establishment of more senior citizen housing. Lovelace said the buildings could be constructed with some of the surplus money in the state budget.


Chester R. Papienski, in filing for the office of Clark County Assessor, has pledged a door to door cam-paign to gather sug-gestions from the voters as to their


