

Mrs. Tannenbaum, in preparation for Hadassah's 64th annual National Convention to meet in Israel September 19 - 25, said: "It is tragic to see the only plura-listic, democratic Arab state fighting for survival. We urge President Carter -in concert with France and the Vatican -- to persuade Syria to halt its unremitting campaign against the Christians, and to sup-port the forces of moderation in Lebanon SO that a viable government can be set up and Syria can withdraw some of its

35,000 troops. "Lebanon today is a country occupied by Syria and the Palestinians," Mrs. Tan-nenbaum said, "it is time that the time that the country be given back to its own people." Regarding the sum-

mit meeting at Camp David, Mrs. Tannenbaum commended President Carter for baum undertaking "the delicate role of mediabetween Presitor dent Sadat and Prime Minister Begin.

"We hope that President Carter will be able to persuade both men to build on the areas of agreement which do exist. This first step could be the example and


