## 3 NATIONS INSIST PEACE TALKS WILL RESUME IN NEAR FUTURE

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Expectations are high in Jerusalem, Cairo and Washington that the Israel - Egyptian peace negotiations will resume soon.

The Cabinet sat in a special session to hear Foreign Minister Moshe Dayan report on his meeting with Egyptian Prime Minister Mustapha Khalil and Secretary of State Cyrus Vance in Brussels. The Cabinet met as a ministerial defense committee and its deliberations were kept secret.

But Premier Menachem Begin, speaking to members of the Soldiers Welfare Committee, stressed that Israel is ready to continue the negotiations and is ready to discuss Egypt's demands concerning self - rule for the Palestinians on the West Bank and Gaza Strip. Begin said Israel will even consider Egypt's request for reviewing the peace treaty. But, he stressed that Israel will never agree to Egypt's demand that the treaty be reviewed after five years only that the treaty could be reviewed without any specific date. Begin also stressed that Israel could not agree to a timetable for the implementation of self - rule since this did not
