

# JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

**NEW YORK** -- Irving M. Engel, 87, a Jewish leader, died at home.

**LOS ANGELES** -- Israel's Deputy Prime Minister Yigal Yadin will be the featured speaker at the United Jewish Appeal Western Region Leadership Conference in Palm Springs January 19 - 21.

**WASHINGTON, D.C.** -- Charles B. Zucker was named Assistant Director of the Architecture, Planning and Design Program of the National Endowment for the Arts.

**NEW YORK** -- The Jerusalem International Numismatic Meeting will be held at the Binyanei Ha'aomah convention center March 11 - 15, 1979.

**NEW YORK** -- The National Conference of Christians and Jews has announced that the national research firm of Louis Harris and Associates has undertaken an in depth survey to determine the shape of racial and religious prejudice and discrimination in America.

**NEW YORK** -- Albert D. Chernin, executive vice chairman of the National Jewish Community Relations Advisory Council, today announced the appointment of Lynne Ianniello as director of public information.

**NEW YORK** -- Former United Jewish Appeal Chairman Paul Zuckerman has been elected Co - Treasurer of the United Israel Appeal.

**RAMAT-GAN, Israel** -- New vistas are being opened to hundreds of senior citizens in Israel through a program launched this year which integrates them into the academic life of Bar-Ilan University.

**NEW YORK** -- The American Jewish Congress has asked the State Department to explain why it listed Jerusalem separately from Israel in a schedule of sites for a U.S. Foreign Service examination on December 10, 1978.

**AMSTERDAM (WNS)** -- Postal authorities are being urged to issue a stamp marking the 50th anniversary of Anne Frank's birth next July.

**JERUSALEM (WNS)** -- Officials of the Energy Ministry said that Israel was in no danger of running out of oil despite the curtailment of production in strife - torn Iran which supplies about 70 percent of Israel's needs. They said Israel would maintain its requirement through purchases in Mexico and the production in the Sinai oil fields.

**NEW YORK** -- Emery Emanuel Klineman, 76, a 40 - year leader in American Jewish Committee, died of cancer.

**SAO PAULO (WNS)** -- The use of Hitler as a pitchman to sell insurance for a local bank caused a storm of protest and the threat by many people to close their accounts. Roberto Chueiri, publicity director of the Bank Real, later apologized for the television commercial.

**JERUSALEM (WNS)** -- The coincidence of Chanukah and Christmas falling on the same date, for the first time since 1940, gave a particular festive air to Jerusalem with the lights of Chanukah menorahs mingling with those of Christmas trees and other decorations.

**TEL AVIV (WNS)** -- The need to revive the feeling that Israel is central in all Jewish life was stressed by S. Z. Abramov as he was installed as the new chairman of the Israeli executive of the World Jewish Congress.

**TEL AVIV (WNS)** -- Leon Dulzin, chairman of the World Zionist Organization and Jewish Agency Executives, put some of the blame for the drop - out rate among Soviet Jewish emigrants on Soviet Jews now living in Israel.

**NEW YORK** -- Rabbi Bernard Rosensweig, President of the Rabbinical Council of America, which represents 1000 Orthodox Rabbis, announced the appointment of Rabbi Abner Weiss, spiritual leader of the Riverdale Jewish Center, New York, N.Y., as Chairman of the Torah Convocation of the Rabbinical Council of America, to be held from January 22nd to January 24th at the Quality Motor Inn, Washington, D.C.

## DAYAN SUGGESTS ISRAEL OFFER COMPROMISE PROPOSALS

**BRUSSELS (WNS)** -- Foreign Minister Moshe Dayan briefed Premier Menachem Begin on his talks in Brussels with Egyptian Prime Minister Mustapha Khalil and Secretary of State Cyrus Vance.

The talks ended after three - and - a - half hours with no agreement for a new date to resume the stalemated peace treaty negotiations but with Egypt and Israel agreeing to maintain contact through Vance. No details of the talks were revealed immediately. Vance told reporters that Dayan and Khalil had "a useful and full exchange of all the issues."

Meanwhile, it was reported here that Dayan is proposing that Israel suggest a compromise proposal that would allow for a review of the peace treaty after a period of time and would set a target date for the implementation of autonomy on the West Bank and Gaza Strip. In return, Israel would demand that Egypt's agreement with Israel would hold priority over its previous

treaties with other Arab countries and that no linkage be made between the Sinai pull-back and autonomy for the occupied territories.

Dayan on his return from Brussels hinted that his proposals would be accepted by Cairo. He said the differences between the two countries could be bridged "if both sides move toward each other's position and if the governments decide they are ready for this." He said the talks in Brussels proved that an agreement was possible. Dayan and Khalil had an informal dinner meeting Dec. 23 the evening before the official meeting began with Vance. Accompanied by their aides, they could be seen in a hotel restaurant talking and occasionally laughing together.

Vance on his return to Washington said the meetings with the Israeli and Egyptian foreign ministers were "helpful." He stressed that the purpose of the talks "was to explore the nature of the next steps to be taken in the negotiations and not

to set a date for the resumption of negotiations." Vance had gone to Brussels from
