DAYAN SUGGESTS ISRAEL OFFER COMPROMISE PROPOSALS

BRUSSELS (WNS) -- Foreign Minister Moshe Dayan briefed Premier Menachem Begin on his talks Brussels with in Egyptian Prime Minister Mustapha Khalil and Secretary of State Cyrus Vance.


