WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Secretary of State Cyrus Vance stressed Jan. Il that the United States is seeking to solve the differences between Egypt and Israel before scheduling another meeting on a peace treaty.

Israel and Egypt have "made clear they want to resume negotiations," Vance told a press conference. He said discussions are now going to find "the best way to get negotiations going again." Vance said the U.S. wants to find "a process to give the negotiations the best chance to be successful. Therefore, we are taking our time in exploring the best way to try to deal with some of the very minor problems before we proceed to sitting down together and to try to thresh out the more difficult issues.

Vance said he would not disclose the positions Egypt and Israel have expressed to the U.S. because that "should be discussed in private negotiations between the two parties and ourselves." Vance noted that the U.S., Egypt and Israel are considering "perhaps having ex-changes" on the ambassadorial level "on the more minor matters" before scheduling a meeting between Egyptian Prime Minister Mustapha Khalil, Israeli Foreign Minister Moshe Dayan and himself. He noted that all sides have agreed they are willing to meet "anywhere."

Meanwhile, Israeli Premier Menachem Begin told a group of British Conservative Members of Parliament in Jerusalem Jan. Il that he was hopeful the negotiations would resume soon. He

should be a basic duty of democratic govern-ments," the Political Committee of the 21nation Council Europe's Parliamentary Assembly has national urged new international action against terrorism, it was disclosed here this week.

The measures proposed include coordination of member governments' positions as regards United Nations activities in this field and the application of the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations: joining the Bon Agreement on sanctions against air piracy; using political and economic influence to dissuade states which aid or abet terrorists from doing so.

The measures also urged that all Member States, whether or not they belong to European Communities, should speedily ratify the European Convention on the Suppression of Terrorism -- so far in force in five countries only

Constitutes A Majority"

Hughes in Nevada

(We believe it is about time to refresh our memory of the late Howard Hughes and the tremendous momentum he set in motion to take Las Vegas from near depression to the most progressive city in the nation.)

Part 1

Before Howard Hughes arrived in Las Vegas on Thanksgiving, 1967, there were 7,500 vacant apartments and 3,000 empty homes, mostly in disrepair caused by vandals. The building personnel had moved to a booming Reno. The federal government had declared a moratorium on new residences. Vegas was in a bad way.

Then the magic name of Howard Hughes brought about almost immediate reversal. New residents flocked here from nearly every state. It was the land of progress for the future and continued to this very day where apartment rentals have increased 200 percent and homes about the same or more. Look around, see what is happening.

Hughes proved his sincerity of settling in Nevada by purchasing major hotels in Vegas and Reno and refused to gouge contractors and subcontractors who would have gone bankrupt. By the time he decided to leave, exactly four years after his arrival on Thanksgiving 1971, he was thoroughly disgusted with vicious personal enemies pecking at him from all sides.

During the four years he spent here we will pursue what he accomplished and what he pro-

posed. You be the judge.

We have the most vivid recollection of Hughes' proposal to build an airport to service, supersonic planes. It was to be the International Airport of the West. Planes from every country would land here. Then they would be helicoptershuttled to San Francisco, Reno. Salt Lake City. Phoenix, etc. It was to be built on Spring Mountain Road where Hughes owned the land practically to the California border.

The Hughes' proposal was to turn over Mc-Carran Airport to him. An impartial respected firm, selected by the county, would appraise the relative values of McCarran and the Hughes Airport. If McCarran was worth more Hughes would pay the difference to the county. If Hughes cost more, he would pay it.

It meant relocating the Hughes Helicopter plant to Las Vegas. It meant taking McCarran away from the flight pattern of planes and highrise strip hotels, preventing them from rising

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
