ANTI-ISRAEL KHOUMEINI ASSURES IRAN'S 65,000 JEWS CIVIL RIGHTS

LATE BULLETIN:

TEHRAN, IRAN -- IRAN'S NEW GOVERNMENT HAS OFFICIALLY BROKEN ALL DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS WITH ISRAEL. AT PRESS TIME, PALESTINE LIBERATION ORGANIZATION LEADER YASSER ARAFAT ARRIVED IN TEHRAN, GREETED WITH HEAD-OF-STATE HONORS. "TODAY IRAN, TOMORROW PALESTINE!" ARAFAT PROCLAIMED AMID CHEERING THOUSANDS AT TEHRAN AIRPORT. ARAFAT VOWED TO CUT OFF ALL OIL SUPPLIES TO ISRAEL AFTER HE MET WITH IRAN'S KHOUMEINI.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini, the Moslem religious leader who has taken control of the Iranian government, and his representatives abroad, have been attempting to reassure Iran's 65,000 Jews that they will receive full religious and civil rights in the Islamic republic he is attempting to create.

Khomeini made this pledge himself when a large delegation of Teheran Jews visited him after the collapse of the government of Prime Minister Shapur Bakhtiar.

In New York, two of Khomeini's representatives in the United States also gave these assurances at a meeting February 10 with Bertram Gold, executive vice president of the American Jewish Committee, and Daniel Mariaschian, director of the Middle Eastern Affairs department of the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith. One of the Iranians, Shahriar Rouhani, spokesman for Khomeini's Interim Committee to Oversee the Activities of the Iranian Diplomatic Corps in the U.S., told Gold and Mariaschian that Jews, along with Christians and Zoroastrians, would have "full civil rights -- both political and religious."

Gold said that while Rouhani expressed the wish that Iranian Jews would remain in the country, he said they would be free to emigrate and would be allowed to sell their property.

About 15,000 of Iran's 80,000 Jews have left since the turmoil began last year. Rouhani said Iran will not sell oil to Israel, South Africa

E. GERMANY GIVES 3 FORMER NAZIS STIFF SENTENCES

PARIS (WNS) -- Three former Nazis accused of having participated in the murder of some 5,000 Russian Jews have received stiff sentences in East Germany.

Two of them, Arno Schumann and Kurt Meltzer, were sentenced to life imprisonment and the third, Rudolf Mikish, to 14 years hard labor.

The trial, which took place several months ago, was made known to West Europe in an attempt to show East Germany is actively punishing Nazis.
