

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Israel's "special relationship" with the United States "is increasingly without influence" within the U.S. government, Sen. Daniel Moynihan (D. NY) warned.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Foreign Minister Moshe Dayan said his role was to "probe... to put forward test ideas, test theses, in order to determine where, in our estimation, understanding or agreement could be reached despite the differences of opinion." However, Dayan stressed he would be operating within the limits set by the Cabinet.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- The last 33 Israelis in Iran arrived in Israel.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- A long-term plan to ensure adequate water for the existing and future settlements on the West Bank would link settlements in the Jordan Valley to the Sea of Galilee by pipelines.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The Jackson - Vanik Amendment is "the only legislative enactment which, to some extent at least, acts as an obstacle to the unbridled tyranny of the Soviet authorities in their emigration policies," according to 68 Soviet Jewish refusniks.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Seif A-Din Zuabi, a veteran Arab member of the Knesset resigned citing his poor health and "the deterioration of relations between Jews and Arabs" in Israel.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Since 96 percent of the world's oil resources are closed to Israel alternative sources of energy should be developed, Energy Minister Yitzhak Modaí recommended. However, he told the Knesset Foreign Affairs and Security Committee that Israel has enough oil reserves to see it through this year.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Twenty families inaugurated a new moshav southwest of Beer-sheba, the first new settlement in the Negev since Sde Boker was established 27 years ago.

AMSTERDAM (WNS) -- A special parliamentary committee has accused the Netherlands government of tacitly condoning the compliance by Dutch firms with the demands of the Arab boycott against Israel.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- A proposal that Yiddish song and prayer be included in the Jewish liturgy was made to the fourth Congress of the World Federation of Polish Jews here by Rabbi Alexander Schindler, president of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations.

WASHINGTON -- Congress should await the results of public hearings now being held by the Internal Revenue Service instead of passing a bill (H. R. 214) that would bar the IRS from revoking the tax exemption of private schools that discriminate on racial grounds.

NEW YORK -- The Jewish experience in the United States and Jewish contributions to American society, from the pre-revolutionary period to the Bicentennial celebration, are the focus of a new book just published.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Deputy Premier Yigael Yadin, who was a member of the Agranat Commission which investigated the reasons for Israel's lack of preparedness for the Yom Kippur War, said he would press for disclosure of the report.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Premier Menachem Begin warmly thanked the United States Feb. 20 for having brought the last 33 Israelis in Iran safely out of that country.

GENEVA (WNS) -- Israel's practices in the occupied territories was strongly condemned by the United Nations Human Rights Commission.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- A Senegalese soldier with the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon was arrested by Israel after he was caught handing over explosives and a detonator to a terrorist in Acre.

MIAMI BEACH -- Tel Aviv University, Israel's largest institution of higher learning with more than 18,000 students, awarded an honorary doctorate to AFL-CIO President George Meany.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Leon Dulzin, chairman of the World Zionist Organization and Jewish Agency Executives, has announced that a national commission is being created to increase the teaching of Israel and Zionism in Jewish schools in the United States.

SITUATION DETERIORATING FOR SYRIAN

NEW YORK (WNS) -- A 37-year-old Syrian Jew, who escaped from Syria with his family last December, told a press conference that the situation in Syria had sharply deteriorated in the last two months.

Wearing a mask, the Jew, who identified himself as Albert, said internal travel restrictions have been reinstated, harassment has intensified and there are frequent arrests and torture of Jews. Albert, who appeared under the auspices of the Jewish Community Relations Council of New York, now lives with his wife and three children in Israel. Speaking Arabic, he said "scores" of Syrian Jews have been escaping in recent weeks. "The remaining family members of those who escaped are tortured," he said. "Many are maimed and injured." Albert said the restrictions on Syrian Jews which were lifted in December, 1976, were reimposed at the beginning of last December after some Syrian Jews escaped.
