Time for Saudi Arabia

While Defense Secretary Harold Brown also stopped off in Israel, Jordan and Egypt on his recent 11 - day tour of the Middle East, most observers agree that the real purpose of his trip was to reassure Saudi Arabia in the wake of the revolution which overthrew the Shah of Iran.

The Saudis are understandably nervous not only about the turmoil in Iran, a situation that is not yet stable despite the apparent victory of the forces of Ayatollah Ruhoilah Khoumeini, but also about the growing threat of Soviet encroachment in the Persian Gulf and the Horn of Africa.

. The United States, which made the mistake of relying on Iran for security in the Persian Gulf, may now have to provide that security itself. Saudi Arabia cannot be relied on for this task nor can Egypt whose President, Anwar Sadat, is asking for increased American arms since he views himself as the new protector of the Gulf and North Africa.

But since U.S. protection is needed, the U.S. must get something in return. It is time that the Carter Administration stop kowtowing to the Saudis because of their oil and begin making some demands of its own.

Brown returned from the Mideast reporting that neither Saudi Arabis nor Jordan had dropped their opposition to the Camp David accords. The U.S. should demand that the Saudis openly support the Camp David agreements smoothing the way for an Israeli - Egyptian agreement. If the Saudis go along so will Jordan.

Stability in the Mideast is as important for Saudi Arabia as it is for Israel or Egypt. It is about time they take some responsibility for that stability in the only constructive way open to them -- support of an Israeli - Egyptian peace treaty. LAS VEGAS ISRAELITE


out" by some of our 'best friends in NATO is not to be discounted. There are reports of an upheaval in Turkey.

The most serious aspect in this growing anti - American campaign lies in the fact that Washington's so - called sophisticated intelligence unit had failed to pinpoint the real source of the conspiracy. True, there is some suspicion that Moscow is behind it. Signs do indeed indicate that such is the case. However, in the view of this writer, the real culprit is the PLO under the insidious guidance of Yasir Arafat who, undoubtedly, is in collusion with the Kremlin.

In his deep - rooted hatred of the United States, second only to his enmity of Israel, Arafat has openly declared time and again that he and his PLO henchmen will strike at American interests not only in the Middle East but in all parts of the world, and he was not bluffing.

Thus, the tragic happenings in Iran, leading to the rabid anti - American onslaughts, must be understood in this context, and the same applies to Afghanistan. The State Department may prefer to blind itself, but the CIA and certainly The White House are not ignorant of the fact that the PLO operates cells in almost every region of the world, even here in the U.S. and certainly within this world organization.

That Arafat and his PLO had played a vital role in the Ayatollah Khomeini revolution is now clear to the world. (But it is not yet clear to Washington what mischief they are presently up to in a score of other unstable countries). For almost ten years now, Arafat's PLO terrorists had had close relations with the Iranian

opposition factions whose 'fedayeen' (note the Arabic name they have adopted) received their guerrilla training in PLO camps. No wonder Khomeini, following his takeover of Iran, voiced his deep gratitude to Arafat and pledged his full support to his anti - Israeli campaign.


Your correspondent must re'emphasize that the Soviets' support of the Palestinian terrorists must be understood in the light of the Kremlin's aspiration to Communize the world, and it is basically in this context that Moscow is pushing for the establishment of an Arafatian state on the West Bank with the view of turning it into a puppet.

Moscow could not have a better ally. Indeed, to the Soviets, the PLO, as a so - called 'liberation' movement, symbolizes global terrorism as directed in the main against the Western states whose capitalist system they hope one day to demolish. Thus, all terrorists, whether they be German, Arab or Japanese, fit into the Soviet scheme in that they are upsetting the equilibrium of the NATO countries by creating constant fear and turmoil in the Iranian fashion among the people of those nations. It now becomes understandable why the German, Japanese and other terrorists -- all claiming a link to the PLO -- continually boast that their aim is world revolution.

Having 'lost' Iran, Washington may at last be waking up to the great peril facing the West in the entire Near East Crescent down to the Indian Ocean. The USSR 'conquest' of Ethiopia, dominating the Horn of Africa, has come as another devastating blow to the U.S. Last week's visit of Secretary of Defense Harold Brown to the moderate Middle East Arab states including Israel and more especially Saudi Arabia, is indicative of America's deep concern over the threatening eruptions shaking the richest oil - region in the world which, should fall into hostile hands, may jeopardize the security of the Western nations.

While the U.S., 'detente' or no 'detente,' SALT or no SALT, looks upon the USSR as its main adversary on the global scene, and such Moscow indeed it, there is no doubt in the mind of this writer that the Kremlin's disguised 'agents,' Arafat and his PLO terrorists, pose a more insidious threat to the security of America in that they are infiltrating the bodywhole of our globe like infectious bacteria.

Washington may still discover that the most potent antidote to this disease is Israel -- let

the Middle East, so that the security and independence of the nations of that part of the world will be maintained." He specifically referred to Defense Secretary Harold Brown's ll - day trip to Saudi Arabia, Jordan, Egypt and Israel from which Brown brought back arms requests from all four countries. Egypt, in particular, is seeking enough arms for it to protect North Africa and the Persian Gulf from Soviet influence. The White House disclosed that it was sending a military mission to Cairo to survey "in detail" Egypt's requirements.

Meanwhile, Sen. Frank Church (D. Idaho), chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, called on a new Middle East policy in which the U.S. rewards those nations that make an effort toward reaching peace. Speaking at the 71st annual dinner of B'nai Zion where he received the organization's American-Israel Friendship Medal, Church said that a "new partnership" should be started "with the first two peacemakers. Israel and Egypt."
