TO HELL WITH GAS HIKES - IF THEY COME GET RECEIPTS - MAY BE REPAID DOUBLE

BEGIN RELENTS; AGREES TO MEET CARTER

WASH. (WNS) -- Israeli Premier Menachem Begin arrived in Washington March 1 for what was expected to be a tense meeting with President Carter at the White House.

Expectations were that the President would put heavy pressure on Israel to sign a peace treaty agreement with Egypt, pressure Begin had vowed to reject. "If there are pressures, I hope that all Israeli citizens share with me the hope that I can stand up to those pressures," Begin said before leaving from Ben Gurion Airport. "I am leaving without an umbrella and I will return without an

umbrella," he added, a reference to charges by Likud hardliners who compared his trip to Neville Chamberlain's journey to Munich in 1938.

The Premier also took issue with Carter's suggestion that the issues between Israel and Egypt in the peace treaty were minor. The current crisis is not over "legalisms," Begin said. He said one of the main points of contention, Article VI of the treaty which deals with the priority of obligations toward Egypt's other treaties with Arab states, is the "heart of the treaty."

Carter said he would not answer any questions on the Middle East. Carter said after receiving Begin's letter he had spoken to both Begin and Sadat by telephone. He said "I have spent more time and invested more of my personal effort" on trying to reach a Mideast peace than on any other problem. He said this was because of the importance of a Mideast peace to the world as well as the countries directly involved. He warned that "If we allow prospects for peace in the Middle East to continue to dim and, perhaps to die, the future at best is unpredictable. If we allow this hope to vanish, the judgment of history, of our children will condemn us."

Meanwhile, Carter has been publicly defending his views.
