"When the time comes, do not hesitate to use your influence," he said in his last public address before returning to Israel to greet President Carter who was on his way to Cairo and Jerusalem in an effort to reach a peace treaty.

Begin's speech was enthusiastically ceived by some 2000 representatives of communities Jewish at the Sheraton Centre Hotel here as well as leaders in Jewish the Los Angeles area who heard the speech . telephone over a hookup. The Premier urged American Jewry to "stand gether" behind Israel "under any circumstances," He pledged that American Jews will always "proud" of the Jewish State. "You know that Israel is ready sacrifices to make risks for peace," he declared

CAIRO (WNS) -- President Carter received a tumultuous welcome as he arrived in Cairo March 8 in his effort to help Israel and Egypt achieve a peace treaty.

Israeli Premier Menachem Begin who returned to Tel Aviv from the United States a few hours later, said a peace treaty was within reach if Egyptian President Anwar Sadat accepted the proposals Carter made March 4 and which were accepted by Israel. But he said if Egypt makes demands for changes that "represent an erosion in the U.S. proposals we shall have to reject them." Begin said he had sent Carter a cable in Cairo wishing him success because "the American leader's success will also be ours."

In prepared statements after Carter and Sadat made the 15 - kilometer trip from the airport to the Qubba Palace in Cairo, both leaders mentioned the need to include the Palestinians in a Middle East peace. In "a just and comprehensive peace, our Palestinian brothers must realize their national rights and regain their freedom," Sadat said. Carter noted that while riding in the car with Sadat, he and the Egyptian leader "repledged ourselves not to disappoint those here, in Israel, among the Palestinians, among the countries also presently in a state of war who depend upon us and others to bring the long unrealized but deeply desired state of peace to this region....' Carter stress-ed that he had come to the Middle East to bring peace to Egypt and Israel which he said would be a "beginning" that would bring us much closer to the broader goal we seek, a real peace, a comprehensive peace, a peace that would reflect the legitimate needs of all those who have suffered so deeply during the last 30 years of conflict, enmity and war. ter declared that "I pray that with God's help, we may remove the remaining obstacles to the conclusion of a peace treaty between Egypt
