

GUIDE LINES FOR ARAB MONEY

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The American Jewish Committee has sent a proposed guideline to 187 leading colleges and universities aimed at preventing those schools from agreeing to discriminatory practices or biased courses in accepting foreign money, it was announced here March 7.

Melvin Merians, chairman of the AJCommittee's national committee on special projects, told a press conference, that the AJCommittee had originally become involved in the issue because of concern that Arab-sponsored programs could be used to spread anti-Semitism or anti-Israel biases on college campuses. But as the issue was studied, he said, it was realized it was "not solely a Jewish problem" but one for all Americans since the "integrity of our colleges and universities" is at stake.

Ira Silverman, director of special programs for the AJCommittee, said there were no objections to "legitimate" programs for the study of the Arab or Islamic world.

But he pointed out that some contributions by Arab countries have specified that Israel be not included in a program of studies on the Middle East and have resulted in slanted courses and lecturers. He said another problem was raised when several American universities have rejected programs under Arab sponsorship because they

would have had to exclude Jewish personnel.

The proposed guidelines would have the university or college state that it will not discriminate on the grounds of race, sex, religion or national origin in hiring or assigning personnel or in the administration of grants, contracts, or other agreements with foreign entities and will not allow these entities to discriminate against the school's personnel.

The school would also agree not to discriminate in the admission of students to the programs. It will also not accept any grant, contract or other agreement which would require it to cancel programs or other contracts with any foreign country. The AJCommittee recommends that all

potential donors be given a copy of the guidelines and that the university assign an officer to the responsibility of monitoring complaints with the guidelines. Silverman said AJCommittee chapters throughout the country would be contacting the schools on the guidelines as well as monitoring any discriminatory programs in their areas.

WHY AUSCHWITZ NOT BOMBED?

WASH. (WNS) -- Two freshmen Senators called March 6 for an investigation of why the allied forces did not attempt to bomb the death camps at Auschwitz during World War II.

Carl Levin (D. Mich.) and Rudy Boschwitz (R. Minn.), himself a refugee from Nazi Germany, made their appeal after the Central Intelligence Agency released aerial re-

connaissance photographs which clearly showed the death camps. "The photographs taken in 1944 and 1955 provide further evidence that Allied authorities were aware of the slaughter taking place at Auschwitz during the latter year of the war, which makes even more disturbing the fact that no direct attempt was even made to disrupt it," Levin declared. He said there

was no reason to try to assess blame now, but an investigation could reveal "how our society and its decision-makers react to human crises. The vicissitudes of the current Administration's human rights policies demonstrate that we, as a nation, still have not resolved this critical problem of how humanitarian concerns should be interrelated with what are perceived to be our overriding political and military interests.

Sen. William Proxmire (D. Wis.), in one of his daily appeals for Senate ratification of the United Nations Genocide Convention pointed to the photographs as further reason for the U.S. to ratify the convention. He said while the memory of Auschwitz is "history" for some "the memory of having witnessed genocide -- is terrifying vivid."

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
