Saudi Arabia's crown prince Fahd gave welcome relief to Egypt, Israel and the United States when he vowed not to join other Arab nations in their boycott of Egypt.

Saudi Arabia currently supports Egypt with \$2 billion in annual aid to Cairo.

Fahd refuses to condemn the proposed peace treaty between Egypt and Israel, but he did warn it would cause "convulsions in the region."

He also said speculation that Saudi Arabia was planning to establish diplomatic relations with the Soviet Union were "pre-mature."

Jordan's King Hussein, however, pledged to oppose the treaty, and pledged to support Palestine guerrillas in punishing Egypt for its break with the Arab world.

When Carter returned to Andrews Air Force Base, he was greeted by Vice President Walter Mondale, members of Congress and thousands of people, many of them White House and State Department employees, cheering and waving small U.S. flags. Some Arab countries have denounced the treaty and some are leading a move for an economic boycott of Egypt.

Carter briefed Congressional leaders later at the White House and Senate Minority Leader Howard Baker (R. Tenn.) revealed that the agreements would require another \$4 billion in aid to Israel and Egypt over the next three years in addition to the U.S. aid now going to the two countries.

But what does this mean for Israel's future?

### A Treaty at Last

"There's good news and bad news," is usually the start of a joke. But not this week, with the stakes so high for our brethren in Israel.

Developments in the Middle East have resembled a ping pong match, with our collective heads turning back and forth on each breath-taking turn of events.

One minute no treaty between Egypt and Israel, the next moment a treaty. Then, sabre-rattling elsewhere in the Arab world as they squirm, hysterically opposed to a treaty.

Everyone followed the pessimism of President Carter's discouraging week. We saw live TV coverage of a squabbling Israeli Knesset, shuttle diplomacy, and diligence and perseverance put to the extreme test. The world held its breath.

At the eleventh hour, at the moment of Carter's impending departure, Defense Minister Dayan telephoned, a hasty meeting was called, and the proposed treaty salvaged. The outline for a treaty emerged, and cautious optimism reigned.

Then Arab venom erupted. The snakes crawled out from under rocks and attempted to poison an already shakey framework for peace.

Sadat, Begin and Carter were hailed as heroes, statesmen, visionaries, giants of their time -- everywhere, except in the Arab world outside of Egypt and Saudi Arabia.

PLO guerrilla leader Yasser Arafat, a murderer of children, was accorded red-carpet treatment in Iran, Syria, Jordan, Lebanon, etc. He shuttled from Teheran to Damascus, Amman to Beirut rallying support against the treaty.

This maniac, this modern-day Hitlerian, Jew-hating barbaric monster thrives on upheaval, bloodshed, war and turmoil. He hates the very thought of peace, tranquility, and normal relations with Israel. He predicts "the whole Middle East will explode" if Egypt and Israel sign this treaty.
