In his acceptance speech at the Nobel Peace Prize Ceremony in Oslo, Prime Minister Menachem Begin called attention to the great Swiss Humanitarian Jean Henri Dunant, who was the first receipient of the Nobel prize for peace in 1901. Mr. Begin mentioned the fact that Dunant was the founder of the International Red Cross. Dunant was also one of the first Christian supporters of a Jewish Homeland, later envisaged by the great Zionist leader Theodor Herzl.

At this important juncture in Israeli history, when the leader of the government of Israel joins Henri Dunant as a Nobel Peace Laureate. it is ironic to have to remind your readers that the Magen David Adom (Red Shield of David) Society is denied recognition by the International Red Cross. In spite of its continued pronouncements that it is founded on the principles of humanitarianism, universality and bro-therhood, the Geneva - based Red Cross or-

stand that Israel should not be forced to use the Christian Red Cross, the Arab Red Crescent or the Red Lion and sun that is used by Iran.

This year marks the 100th anniversary of the birth of Dunant, the great friend of the Jewish people and thd founder of the International Red Cross, Operation Recognition has accepted the responsibility to coordinate worldwide efforts on behalf of MDA recognition with cooperating committees in 40 countries.
