## No Reason for Gloom

There seems to be a tendency in some quarters, both among Jews and non - Jews, to play down the historic achievement of the peace treaty signed by Israeli Premier Menachem Begin and Egyptian President Anwar Sadat at the White House March 26. After the jubilation and excitement that followed Sadat's visit to Jerusalem in November, 1977, and the Camp David accords of last September, the attitude toward the peace treaty among many appears to be, "so what!"

Newspaper and television pundits were quick to remind us that the rest of the Arab world does not accept the treaty and that the Palestinian problem was unsolved. They appeared to imply that the treaty really didn't mean much. These were many of the same commentators who only a few weeks earlier were wringing their hands because they claimed that an Israeli - Egyptian treaty could not be achieved because of Israeli intransigence.

No one denies that there are major difficulties ahead, least of all the American Jewish community which is deeply concerned about the fate of Israel. Real peace requires acceptance of Israel by all its Arab neighbors.

But this does not detract from the tremendous achievement of the peace treaty. For the first time in its nearly 31 - year history Israel has the recognition of one of its neigh-It is at peace with the major Arab country, the one country without whose participation other Arab countries have not been able to wage war against Israel up to now.

Egypt and Israel will have a rough time with each other during the next three years as they seek to implement the treaty. But no one can imagine the effect on the two countries when their borders open up starting May 26. The results of an exchange of tourism, trade and culture cannot be foreseen now but they can only be good.

The other Arab nations may rant and threaten both Israel and Egypt. There will be incidents of terrorism. But they will only be momentary. The momentum created by the Egyptian - Israel treaty can eventually permeate the rest of the Middle East, and other Arab countries may find they are being drawn into it no matter how they feel, media pundits notwithstanding.

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) - Israel and world Jewry have reason for special rejoicing this Passover 5739, and no amount of threats from the modern Hamans in Iraq, Libya, Syria and Beirut can dampen the global celebrations of the double events -- the exodus from ancient Egypt and the 'nes' of peace with m dern Egypt -marking historic milestones in the destiny of the children of Israel.

Nor will the begrudging, negative attitude of the majority in this House of Contention -- do-

minated by the totalitarian - Soviet bloc and the malcontent radical Arabs with some of their third world partners -- have any effect whatsoever upon this special 1979 Passover commemoration.

For, once again, as in past biblical history, a nes, a miracle, has been wrought - before the eyes of the whole world. The most powerful of all Arabs states, Egypt -- the nation which in antiquity precipitated Passover and which, during the past 30 years, spearheaded the four onslaughts against the Jewish State -- signed a peace treaty with Judea here in this Land of the Free established by the biblically-imbued Founding Fathers.

And the three signers, Begin, Carter and Sadat, in sensing the providentiality of the occasion, spoke of the Creator, the Ged of Abraham, and cited both the Bible and the Koran with Isaiah's prophecy of peace predominating.

Historic times? Indeed, we are in them! Prophetic times? No doubt! It's all written, decreed! What inspirited Sadat to visit Israel's Terusalem to the dismay of the whole Arab Nation? The answer, undoubtedly, must lie in the great mystery enveloping the Land of the Pharaohs, a nation eternally linked, in peace and war, with Israel.

As far back as Genesis, we are told that Abraham, after experiencing famine in Canaan, "went down to Egypt to sojourn there." Out of the intended evil of the Pharaoh, as out of the intended evil of Joseph brethren. came good, yea, redemption for Israel, and a new light, a new dawn for all mankind -- the Sinaitic Code, the first pages of the Bible, the Torah, the Ten Commandments which have influenced the whole world.

It is Passover 5739! Watch and see the enfoldment of prophetic fulfilment for "destruction" and "reconstruction." It cannot fail.
