

W. GERMAN LEADER WANTS NAZI LAW EXTENDED

BONN (WNS) -- West German Chancellor Helmut Schmidt has urged the Bundestag to abolish the law setting Dec. 31 as the time limit for trying Nazi war criminals in Germany.

"I am against the limitation," he said as the West German Parliament began debate on the law

March 29. "We do not know how many Nazi crimes will be discovered in the coming years and we could not bear it if the murderers would stand up and say, 'yes, I did it,' once they became immune to prosecution. Schmidt said his opinion "is based on the conviction

that the deliberate destruction of human life cannot be undone by the passage of time."

However, Schmidt said the members of Parliament are free to vote their conscience on the issue. While noting that many Jewish organizations and the governments of Is-

rael and Poland had urged that Bonn repeal the time limit, he stressed "the decision is up to us." Johan Baptist Gradl, a member of the opposition Christian Democratic Union, also spoke up for repeal. "We cannot slough off the history of our people and we must understand that many nations, East and West, are now recalling the Nazi era," he said.

In New York, Rabbi Arthur Schneier, president of the Appeal of Conscience Foundation, and Jacques Torczyner a member of the Executive of the World Zionist Organization - American Section, predicted that the extension

of the time limit will be adopted "by a slim majority." They had recently returned from a 10-day visit to West Germany where they had met with Schmidt, other political leaders and leaders of the Catholic, Protestant and Jewish communities.

BEGIN ARRIVES IN CAIRO FOR VISIT

CAIRO (WNS) -- Israeli Premier Menachem Begin arrived in Cairo in 108 degree weather April 2 for the first official visit by an Israeli head of government to Cairo. He was greeted at the airport by Egyptian Vice President Hosni Mubarak

as an Egyptian band played both the Israeli and Egyptian national anthems. After a brief ceremony Begin reviewed the honor guard. Begin was then driven to the Tahra Place Hotel, just outside Cairo, where Begin was staying for the two-day visit. Begin's schedule includes meetings with Egyptian President Sadat, a visit to the Pyramids and evening services at the Cairo synagogue. Before leaving Ben Gurion Airport, Begin said that his visit to Egypt demonstrates the revolution that was brought to the Middle East by the Egyptian-Israeli peace treaty.
