COMMUNITY SEDER AT WEST POINT

LAXALT ASKS ABOUT GAS SHORTAGES

Nevada Sen. Paul Laxalt has asked Energy Secretary James Schlesinger to determine why gasoline shortages appear to be more prevalent in the Reno - Sparks area than in other parts of the nation.

"This past weekend, large numbers of gasoline stations were either closed or had to greatly curtail operations," Laxalt said in a tele-

gram sent Wednesday. The Nevada Republican said the telegram went to Schlesinger after Reno - Sparks area service station operators contacted his office asking for help.

In the telegram, Laxalt noted the situation "threatens the tourism - based economy of the area and the survival of numerous small businesses and has

The message asked that Schlesinger investigate the causes of the situation and report back to Laxalt as promptly as possible.

"Additionally, I would like to know what steps can be taken to alleviate the situation," Laxalt said, noting, "It appears the problems are more critical in the area than elsewhere in the nation."

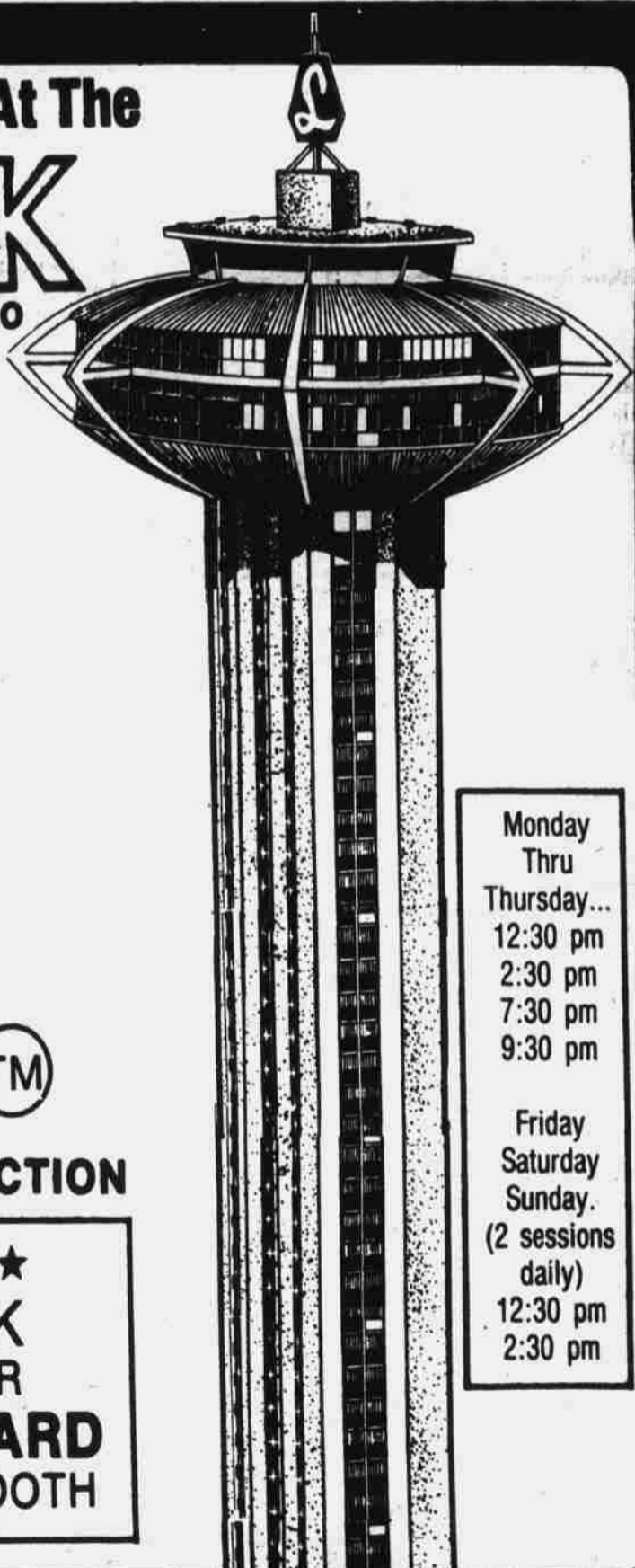
