Egypt. Mondale stressed that the supply of oil to Israel is unlikely to become a problem since Israel does not require much. Mondale praised Norway for its strong support of the peace treaty.

Meanwhile, Israeli Energy Minister Yit-zhak Modai met his Egyptian counterpart Ahmed Ezzeddin Hilal for a tour of the Sinai oilfields April 17. The Egypstressed that tian will honor Egypt its commitment to supply Israel with Sinai oil under the terms of the peace The treaty. two ministers agreed to joint comset up a mittee to deal with technical matters.

JERUSALEM (WNS, -- The Egyptian government has given its permission for an Israeli rabbi to serve as the spiritual head of the small Jewish community in Cairo, Sepharadi Chief Ovadia Yoseph said in Jerusalem.

Yoseph said that President Egyptian Anwar Sadat agreed that a rabbi should be immediately sent from Israel, and indicated that the Egyptian government would finance the new rabbi's expenses out of state religious funds.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The crack that appeared in the relations between Israel and Egypt following Egyptian Prime Minister Khalil's statement that Egypt would aid Syria should it seek to retain control of the Golan Heights appears to have been smoothed over.

In a conciliatory interview on Israel TV the night of April 14, Khalil said he was certain both sides intended to carry out their obligations under the Israeli - Egyptian peace treaty. Earlier, both Premier Menachem Begin and Foreign Minister Moshe Dayan sent sharp protests to the United States over Khalil's remarks. Having made their point forcefully and publicly, they no longer seem inclined to pursue the issue further.

In addition. Begin used his newly installed "hot line" to Egyptian President Anwar Sadat as part of the effort to cool the dispute. The conversation was reportedly friendly, but Begin pointed out firmly that Israel could not accept Khalil's view. According to the Egyptian, the aid to Syria would come under their mutual defense pact. But according to Israel, the peace treaty, under its priority of obligations clause. would bar Egypt from intervening in any attack upon Israel by an Arab state.
