WASHINGTON (WNS) -- President and Mrs. Carter joined the family of Stuart and Fran Eizenstat at the first Passover seder at the home of his assistant for domestic affairs.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Sen. Abraham Ribicoff (D. Conn.) told reporters here that he would support Israel's request for easier repayment terms on the aid it will receive from the United States to help cover the costs of the Sinai pullback.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Yosef Ciechanover, the Foreign Ministry's director general, met with Pope John Paul II for 45 minutes at the Vatican April 23.

VIENNA (WNS) -- Police said that a Palestinian terrorist group may have been responsible for an explosion that blasted doors and windows at the Vienna Jewish Center April 22 not neo - Nazis as first thought.

STRASSBOURG (WNS) -- Delegations representing 110 organizations of former resistance fighters and deportees from 20 countries demonstrated here April 21 against the emergence of neo - Nazis in Europe.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- A slight tremor was felt throughout Israel April 23 causing slight damage to some houses in Tel Aviv, Netanya and Hebron.

TEL AVIV - A team of Tel Aviv University scientists and engineers has designed a new automobile engine which reduces gasoline consumption by 10% - 20%.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The United States has criticized Israel for deciding to establish two new settlements on the West Bank, but stressed the decision will not affect U.S. -Israeli relations.


