IRAN RIPS INTO U.S. AND JAVITZ

(WNS) --WASH. Both the Carter Administration and Sen. Jacob Javits (R. NY) have urged Americans to show restraint in the wake of attacks from Iranian officials.

Avatollah Ruhollah Khomeini called the U.S. a "wounded snake" and Javits and his wife, Marian, were singled out for vilification by · Sadegh Ayatollah Khalkhali, head of the revolutionary tribunal, who said the Javitses were wanted in Iran .for "corruption and misappropriation of Iranian public funds." Meanwhile, Nazihunter Serge Klarsfeld has gone to Teheran from Paris to protest the execution of Habib Elkanian, the former Jewish community leader, and to try assist four Iranian Jews still held in "revolutionary Islamic' jails.

Iranian Justice Minister Assadollah Mobasherin told Klarsfeld May 24 that Iran's Jews have nothing to fear from the new regime, In another report from Teheran, a major and sergeant in the Shah's army were executed and two were given generals long prison terms. One of them, Gen. Manoucher Vajdi, was sentenced to 15 years in prison after being accused of collaborating with the secretservice of Israel.

BEGIN AND SADAT AGREED ON OPEN BOR-DERS TO COMMENCE IMMEDIATELY ON MAY 27.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Whether the borders between Israel and Egypt are open soon will depend on what Israeli Premier Menachem Begin and Egyptian President Anwar Sadat decide when they meet in El Arish May 27.

This was made clear after Foreign Minister Moshe Dayan met with Boutros Ghali, Egyptian Minister of State for Foreign Affairs, there May 22. Sadat and Begin had agreed at their meeting in Cairo that the borders would be opened after El Arish is turned over to Egyptian rule May 25. But Ghali said the borders will be opened in accordance with the Israeli - Egyptian peace treaty which calls for their opening nine months after the treaty is ratified. Begin before leaving for London May 22 rejected Ghali's contention. He said that one time previously when Ghali had made a similar statement Sadat contradicted him. Begin said he would clarify the issue when he meets with Sadat.

Dayan told reporters that if the borders are not opened immediately no Israeli fishing crafts would be permitted in Egyptian territorial waters, meaning the waters off El Arish, and no Egyptian crafts could operate off the Gaza Strip. He said El Arish residents would not be able to go to their jobs in Israel or Israeliheld Sinai. El Arish farmers would not be allowed to tend their fields on the Israeli side
