TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Some El Arish residents have found that the return of Egyptian rule after 12 years has not been the blessing they had anticipated. Many families have been ejected from apartments to make room for the Egyptian officers now quartered in the Sinai town.

Some workers have evaded the Egyptian checkpoints by scaling the border fence. Power to the laundry from El Arish was cut off but it was restored when the laundry was connected to the Israeli electrical system.




