## BEGIN LASHES AT NEW YORK TIMES; NEW SETTLEMENTS WILL CONTINUE

ple's Entratter Social Hall immediately after the conclusion of services.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The controversy over the Israeli Cabinet's approval of a new Gush Emunim settlement near Nablus continues to grow within Israel and abroad. Premier Menachem Begin lashed out at his critics within Israel and outside. He reiterated his insistence that Israel has "full right to settle in all parts of Eretz Israel." Begin accused Israelis who call the new settlement of Alon Moreh "provocation" of adopting "the evil path of the enemies of our people."

He said, "If now there be Israelis of certain outlooks who accept the assumption that the presence of Jews alongside Arabs in our historic homeland, constitutes a provocation, then shame on them. By doing so they adopt the evil path of the enemies of our people." Begin's words were aimed specifically at the Peace Now Movement which held massive demonstrations at the site of Alon Moreh.

But the Premier lashed out at statements by President Carter's National Security Advisor, Zbigniew Brzezinski and an editorial in the New York Times criticizing his settlement policy. Interviewed on ABC-TV's "Issues and Answers" June 10, Brzezinski said he welcomed the protests by Israelis against the West Bank settlements. He said the U.S. was "troubled" by the establishment of the new settlement near Nablus "because it could contribute to a reversal" of the peace process. "We want the momentum" of the Egyptian - Israeli peace treaty "to be continued and not to be reversed," he said. (Continued on Page 3)

### MUST RETAIN WEST BANK

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) -- "Israel must retain the West Bank as a buffer which is necessary for a viable defense against hostile neighbors. The security of Israel must not be jeopardized."

Thus declared Congressman Lester L. Wolff (D. N.Y.) in a statement which reached the WUP UN

Bureau from Washington this week.

A ranking member of the House Foreign Affairs Committee and who served as a leading U. S. delegate in this world organization in 1977, Cong. Wolff's statement contains some basic points he had raised in an address delivered at a Bnai Zion confab here earlier this month. One of these relates to Israel's right to build settlements in the territories.

"I am basing my support for these settlements on undisputed historical fact," he stated. "Technically, Israel has long had the right to settle in the so-called occupied areas. Those who criticize Israel's new settlements are in error," he emphasized. "Israel, under the mandate, continues to have the full right of settlement on the West Bank, as they have had since World War II, and will continue to have this right until a peace agreement between Israel and the Arabs says otherwise."
