OTTAWA (WNS) -- Government sources confirmed that the state - owned Air Canada has signed a contract with Saudi Arabia for the maintenance of Saudi aircraft that includes a clause barring the employment of Israeli nationals for such work. An Air Canada spokesman said the airline had checked with the Ministry for External Affairs which did not find any variance with present Canadian legislation aimed against the Arab boycott of Israel.

AMSTERDAM (WNS) -- Foreign Minister Christopher Van Der Klaauw has no intention of moving the Dutch Embassy in Israel from Jerusalem where it has been since 1949, according to a Dutch newspaper. The report said that while the Arabs have brought pressure on countries not to move embassies from Tel Aviv they have not approached countries that already have embassies in Jerusalem.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Foreign Ministry has given Israelt travel agents the green light to begin organizing group charter and individual tourist flights to Egypt. The first Israeli tourist to Egypt, 19 - year - old Ofra Gamel, returned to Tel Aviv June 13 abroad a yacht after a threeday visit. Although she had an Israeli passport and no Egyptian visa, Egyptian authorities allowed her to land at Port Said.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Shmuel Rechtmann, the Likud MK serving a 3-1/2 year prison term for accepting bribes, resigned from the Knesset at the urging of his party colleagues. His action came after he was visited at the Ramla jail by Abraham Sharir, the Likud whip, and Haim Corfu, chairman of the coalition faction.



UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- The Security Council voted 12 to 0 to extend the mandate of the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon for another six months. The resolution also "strongly deplores acts of violence against Lebanon that have led to the displacement of civilians, including Palestinians, and brought about the destruction and loss of innocent lives." The resolution called on Israel "to cease forthwith its acts against the territorial integrity, unity, sovereignty and political independence of Lebanon, in particular, its incursions into Lebanon.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Negotiations will begin September between the World Federation of Polish Jews and the Polish government over a series of demands by Polish Jews living outside Poland. The World Jewish Congress, which will negotiate for the Federation, will discuss with the Polish government such issues as the transfer to Israel of documents, religious objects and various books now in Poland and compensation for the destruction of Jewish property such as synagogues, schools, orphanages and communal institutions.
