


Behind The Scenes At The United Nations

UNITED NATIONS (WUP) -- Poland, one of the most tragically affected European countries by World War II, having lost over two million of its children and young people, the majority of whom Jews, alerted this world organization this week to the fact that 1979 continues to be in fact the International Year of the Child and that the Nazi atrocities perpetrated against children must put governments on guard against those in high offices who seek to apply statutory limitations to war crimes.

Henryk J. Sokalski, Charge d'Affaires of the Polish Mission to the UN, transmitted a document


on a train leaving from the siding at Odansk Railway Station in Warsaw. All the trains leaving from there were bound for the same place: the Treblinka II camp...Most probably the whole group was sent to a gas chamber immediately on arrival. The Nazis were in a great hurry then and, after all, Jews went right to the front of the queue to the gas chamber."

Janusz Korczak was a renowned physician and educator as also an author of fame. His name in Poland figures among the most famous patriots of the nation.

The Polish document sent to the Secretary-General and which was requested to be circulated as an official document of the General Assembly, declares that "Persons responsible for Nazi crimes against children and young persons, that most brutal type of genocide, should be brought to justice."

It then reports that "the participants in the International Scientific Session stated that it is alarming that considerations at play in the Federal Republic of Germany result, in practice, in a situation in which proceedings have not yet been started against many thousands of Nazi criminals and a fair share of those brought to trial are being acquitted....

"The planned application in the Federal Republic of Germany, as at 31 December 1979, of statutory limitations to even the gravest Nazi crimes is at variance with the moral FRIDAY, JUNE 29, 1979

another city. Suppose B writes his acceptance and puts it in the mail. Is that a contract?" "Yes, Sir."

"Why?"

"Because the minds have met on the deal."

"Suppose that A has changed his mind and sent B a telegram withdrawing his offer and the telegram is received by B before his letter of acceptance reaches A? Is there a contract?"

And Nizer's Professor continues..... their minds "hadn't met," how could one mind accept while the other had withdrawn? Hasn't the offerer the right to withdraw before he learns of the other party's acceptance?

"So you would change your previous answer, Mr. Nizer." The mental torture was without a solution.

One story he tells is that late one night in 1948 President Harry Truman was wrestling with the question of when to support the new State of Israel. Thus, Truman's wire forever became the first to recognize the besieged State of Israel.

Nizer's life and tales prove that even the rich and powerful have weak spots and vulnerabilities.

And when we get desperate, only the best will do. And for the chosen few, Louis Nizer (who's first real case was pleaded before the New York State Supreme Court) has been the only shoulder to lean on.

to Secretary - General Kurt Waldheim which he had received from his Minister of Justice, Prof. Jerzy Bafia, and Janusz Wieczorek, chairman of Poland's Main Commission for the Investigation of Nazi War Crimes, and Deputy Chairman of the National Commission for the International Year of the Child, respectively. The document included an annex which contained data on the International Scientific Session held in Warsaw from 26 to 28 April 1979 under the heading "The Child in the Second World War."

As your correspondent read this important document, submitted here so soon after Pope John Paul II's historic and precedent-breaking supplicatory visit to Auschwitz and Birkenau as viewed by the whole world, two names came to mind, that of Anne Frank, about whom so much has been written, and Janusz Korczak-Henryk Goldszmit, a martyr - hero in Poland, but little known in the United States.

Both Anne Frank and Dr. Korszak had written diaries in the shadow of death -- Anne as a young courageous Jewish girl, Janusz who, while he could have saved his life, chose to die with the children of the Warsaw orphanage under his care. In his 222 - page volume, arthur Marek Jaworski notes that "on 5 August 1942, Korszak, the children and the rest of the staff were put feelings and the sense of justice of nations," the document warned. "For this reason, the exclusion of war crimes and crimes against humanity from the statute of limitations, in accordance with the Convention on the Non-Applicability of Statutory Limitations to War Crimes and Crimes Against Humanity, adopted by the General Assembly on 26 November 1968, should become a universally - binding norm of international law and should be a factor preventing the violation of the elementary rights of the child."

Most members of this world organization, it seems, have forgotten the hell which the bestial Nazis let loose upon our planet during World War II and they overlook the fact that it was the Hitlerian Holocaust that led to the decision to establish the United Nations in 1945. Deeply preoccupied with the current agenda items including those which have become, .an obsession to them -- over Israel reborn, these very members act dumb at the very mention of 'Holocaust.' Not all, thank God, are so inclined, and certainly not the masses of people they assume to represent, hundreds of millions to whome the Holocaust came alive again in all its stark horror when Pope John Paul II kneeled in prayer at Auschwitz.
