concerned" about the "further escalation of hostilities in and over Lebanon." He urged "all parties concerned to exercise restraint and to give their cooperation to the establishment of an effective cease - fire in the area. Damascus Radio did not mention the dogfight for at least three hours after it happened.

It admitted that four Syrian planes had been hit but claimed that two Israeli planes were shot down. Israel and Syria have not clashed since the separation of forces agreement on the Golan Heights was signed five years ago. Gen. Yehoshua Saguy, Chief of Israeli Military Intelligence, said it is believed that Syria decided to intervene because of internal problems and because the Arab League is scheduled to decide the future of the Syrian - led force in Lebanon.

The first U.S. reaction came from State Department spokesman Tom Reston in Washington who said the use of American - made aircraft "has been of serious concern to us and to members of Congress." Reston said the U.S. was not in a position to place blame for the battle but "We call on both Israel and Syria to exercise maximum restraint."
